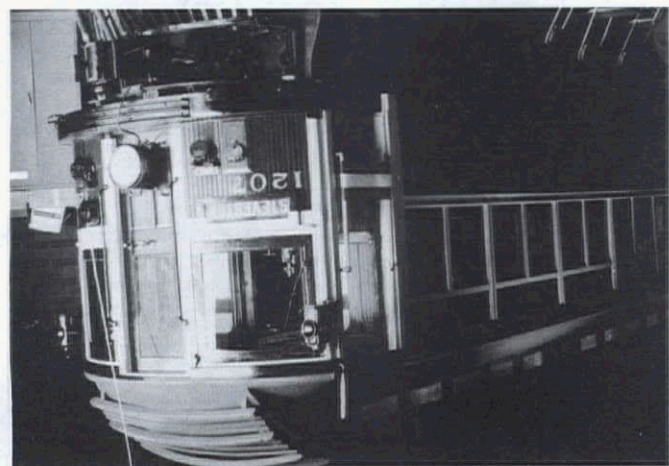


A ceremony to introduce the interurban and recognize the people responsible for its return to B.C. and restoration, was held on Thursday, March 19 at Port Coquitlam Transit Centre. Those on the platform included Vancouver Regional Transit Commission Chairman Murray Dykeman, B.C. Transit President and CEO Michael O'Connor, Assistant GM at SkyTrain Dennis Cooney who headed up the project, and Burnaby Transit Centre Manager Brian Kelly who found and negotiated the return of the #1207. (Pic above left) Former B.C. Transit Vice President Vic Sharmman and the Chairman have cut the ribbon while former Motorman Frank Renard looked on. Mr. Sharmman actually drove this particular tram on the Steveston run at the beginning of his career. 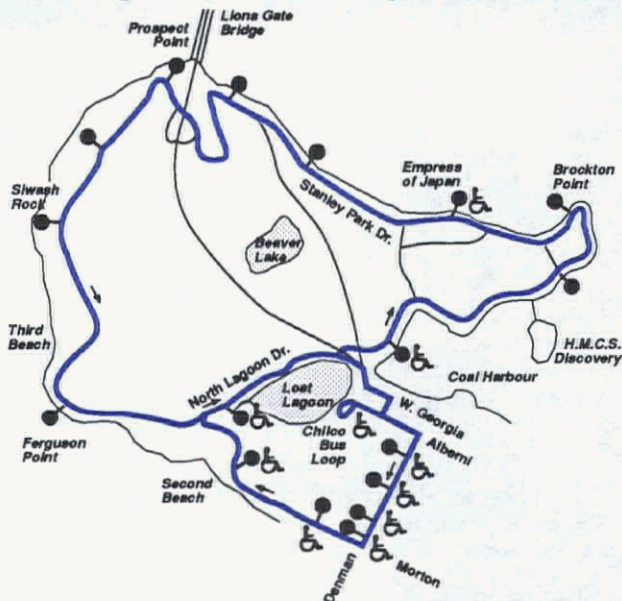


This magnificent tram, built in B.C. Electric's New Westminster shops in 1905, has been returned to its former glory. Car No. 1207 was in regular service on the New Westminster/Marpole and Vancouver/Steveston lines for over 50 years. After its final run in 1958, it was taken to Snoqualmie Falls in Washington State where it was found in 1989 and returned to B.C. The retiring Chairman of BC Transit, Stuart Hodgson, says he hopes a suitable place will be found to operate No. 1207 in the near future.

Wheelchair Accessible Around the Park Service begins Saturday April 4

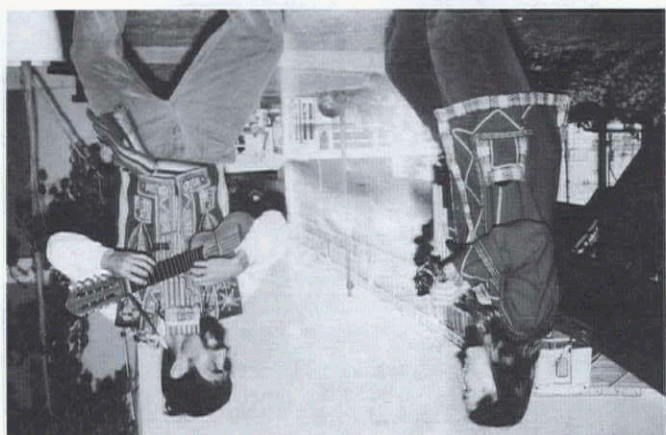


The 52 Around the Park service that operates Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays until the end of October, will again be wheelchair accessible at selected stops (See map). Accessible stops will show the international wheelchair decal. Buses will leave Stanley Park Loop every hour, on the hour, from 10 am to 7 pm. Additional service will be provided when fine weather and special events create demand. The route allows passengers to board and alight outside the park. From Chilco Loop buses will travel via Alberni, Denman, Morton, Beach, Stanley Park Drive, North Lagoon Drive, Stanley Park Drive, North Lagoon Drive, Georgia, Gilford and Alberni. The complete circle tour takes approximately 30 minutes. Regular fares and transfers apply.

141 Kootenay Loop

Cambridge Street section discontinued

Because of very low ridership levels, the portion of the #141 route on Cambridge Street, between Boundary Road and Skeena Street, Vancouver, will be discontinued effective April 6.

This section of the route was introduced on a temporary basis in February 1990 with the condition it would be discontinued if the number of people using it was low.

Cambridge Street residents can continue to use the route by boarding on Boundary Road. Departure times at Kootenay Loop will not change.

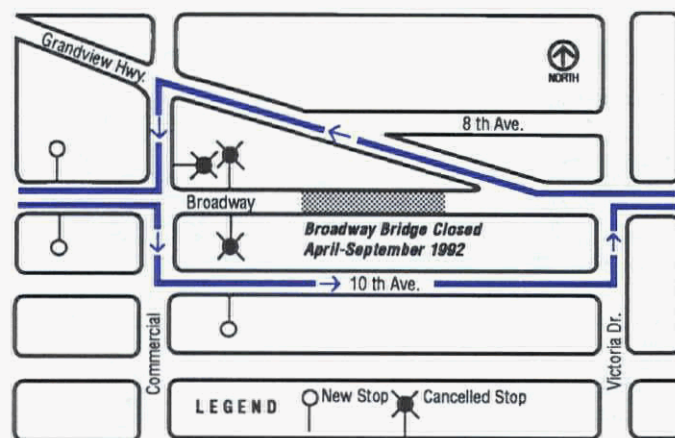

Vancouver

2 Park & Ride/Downtown
PM rush hour departure times will be adjusted slightly.



9 Boundary/UBC
Until September only rush hour service will be provided to UBC. From April 6 to September 6, buses will be rerouted between Commercial and Victoria while the Broadway Bridge is being constructed (See map). Eastbound buses will travel via Broadway, Commercial Drive, 10th Avenue, Victoria and Broadway. Westbound buses will travel via Broadway, Grandview Highway, Commercial Drive and Broadway. As a result of these detours, departure times will be adjusted slightly.

20 Victoria/Granville
Departure times throughout the day will be adjusted slightly.

25 Brentwood/Blanca Loop
Until September, the route will terminate at Blanca Loop

31 Broadway Station/UBC
Until September, Monday to Friday service frequency will change from every 15 minutes to every 30 minutes.

32 Dunbar/Downtown

North Vancouver

226 St.Patricks/Lonsdale Quay/Pemberton Hts
The route number for the Pemberton Heights and St.Patricks portions of the #236 route will be renumbered #226. The #236 will continue to operate between Lonsdale Quay and Grouse Mountain (via Pemberton Heights) from April to October, as shown below. During the PM rush hour, #236 buses will provide service to Pemberton Heights.
