

BC Transit services to Tsawwassen and Horseshoe Bay ferry terminals

Tsawwassen

A reminder that the #640 provides hourly service between Scottsdale Mall and Tsawwassen Ferry Terminal, with connections to other parts of the region at Ladner Exchange and Matthews Exchange.

The first #640 leaves leaves Scottsdale Mall at 7:45 am, Monday through Friday, 7:54 am on Saturdays and 7:57 on Sundays and holidays. The last bus leaves at 9:57 pm. The first #640 leaves Tsawwassen Terminal at 8:57 am, Monday through Saturday and 9:02 am on Sundays and holidays. The last bus leaves at 11:02 pm.

Horseshoe Bay

West Vancouver "Blue Buses" provide a #250 bus from downtown Vancouver (Homer at Georgia), via Marine Drive, to Horseshoe Bay every 15 minutes during rush hours and every 30 minutes at off-peak times. In addition, the #257 Express operates from downtown Vancouver, via the Upper Levels Highway, every 30 minutes during rush hours and every two hours at other times, including weekends and holidays.

Wheelchair accessible service is available on some trips of the #250.

The faster way from the east: 41 UBC Express

This new rush hour, limited-stop, express service, which follows the 41 UBC route, was introduced in January.

Buses leave Joyce Station at 7:31 am and 7:36 am, arriving at UBC at 8:12 am and 8:18 am.

Along the route, stops are made for passenger pick-up only at Joyce at Kingsway, 41st at Rupert, Clarendon, Victoria, Knight, Fraser, Main, Cambie, Oak and Granville. From 41st at Granville, buses operate non-stop to Marine Drive and Camosun. From there to UBC Loop, they stop at all stops for pick-up and discharge of passengers.

West Vancouver "Blue Bus" schedule revisions, effective February 22

250 Vancouver

The weekday early morning schedule of the #250 will be revised to improve connections with the **239 Lonsdale Quay** at Park Royal. The first trip will leave West Bay at **5:28 am** and Park Royal at **5:40**. An additional trip to Vancouver will leave 25th Street & Marine Drive (Dundarave) at **6:02 am** and Park Royal at **6:10**.

257 Vancouver Express

The Bowen Island ferry schedule has been revised; the first sailing will arrive at Horseshoe Bay at **6:05 am**. The #257 will leave the ferry terminal at **6:15 am**, arriving downtown at **6:49**.

#315 and #317 routes changed effective February 8

The westbound #315 from Scott Road Station now travels via the access road, Scott Road, Grace Road, River Road and then the regular route to Ladner Exchange.

The eastbound #315 from Ladner Exchange now travels via the regular route to River Road at Centre, then via River Road, 117 Ave, Grace Road, Scott Road and the access to Scott Road Station.

The westbound #317 from Scott Road Station now travels via the access road, Scott Road, Grace Road, River Road and then the regular route to Scottsdale Mall.

The eastbound #317 from Scottsdale Mall now travels via the regular route to River Road at Centre, then via River Road, 117 Ave, Grace Road, Scott Road and the access to Scott Road Station.

Passengers wishing to board either route at 96 Avenue should do so at Scott Road Station or on Scott Road at Tannery Road.

Schedule changes

All westbound #315 trips now leave Scott Road Station five minutes later than shown in the public timetable. All trips continue to leave Ladner Exchange at the times shown in the timetable, but arrive five minutes earlier than shown.

All #317 trips leave at the times shown in the public timetable
