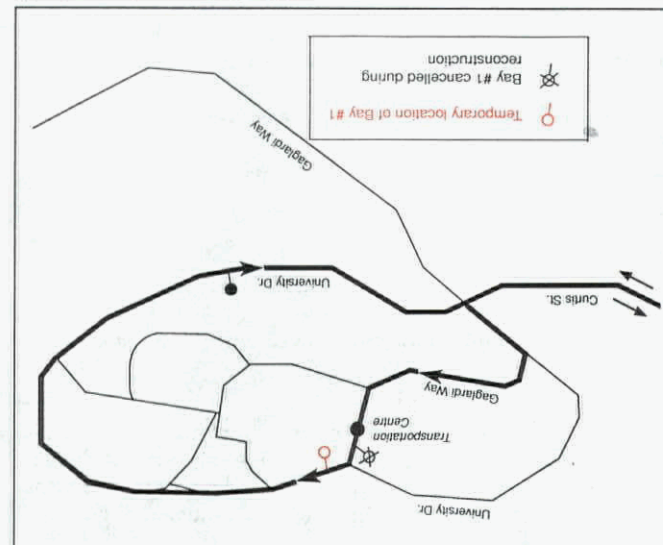

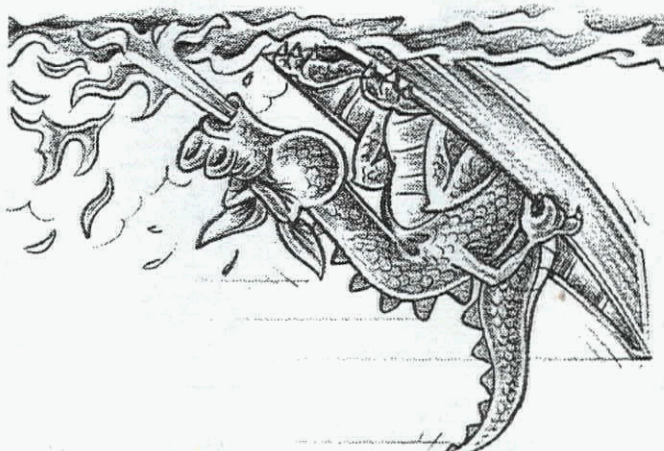

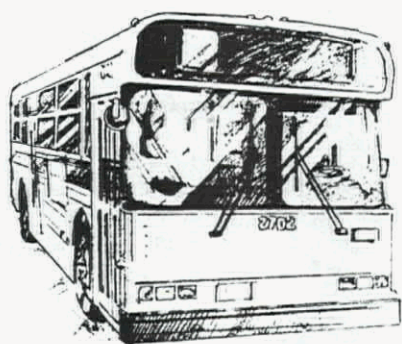

 Winner of the City Category and Grand Champion was Ernie

 Champion, Bill Collins of Surrey. Third place went to Ron
 Brown of Victoria, and two-time Grand Champion Mirk Koliyky
 came in fourth.

 McCormick of Victoria; in second place was Doug Macdonald

To reduce waiting time and overcrowding, midday service frequency will be increased to every five minutes. Midday service to UBC will be discontinued for the summer months. Sunday/holiday departure times will be adjusted slightly.

15 Cambie/Downtown

For the summer months, peak period departure times will be adjusted slightly.

19 Metrotown Station/Stanley Park

Monday-Friday departure times will be adjusted slightly.

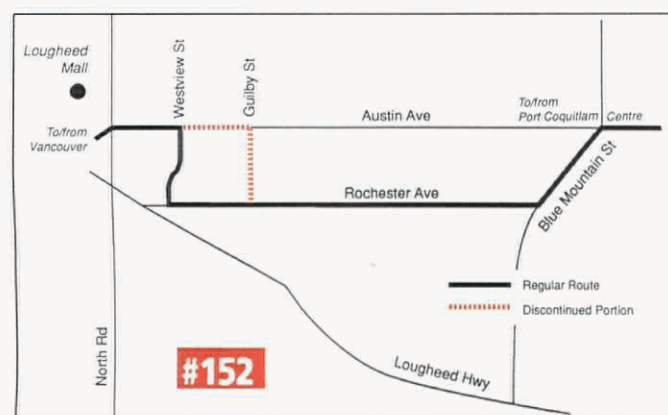

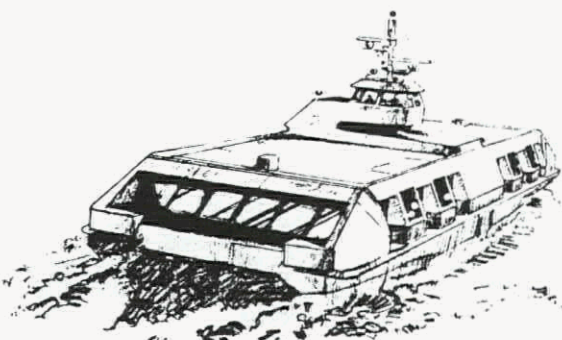

SeaBus ♿

210 Upper Lynn Valley/Vancouver ♿

214 Blueridge/Phibbs Exchange/Vancouver ♿

The trip scheduled to leave Sechelt & Hyannis at 7:30 am will operate only to Phibbs Exchange. For service to Vancouver transfer to the #210 or #211.

226 Lonsdale Quay/Pemberton Heights/St. Patricks ♿

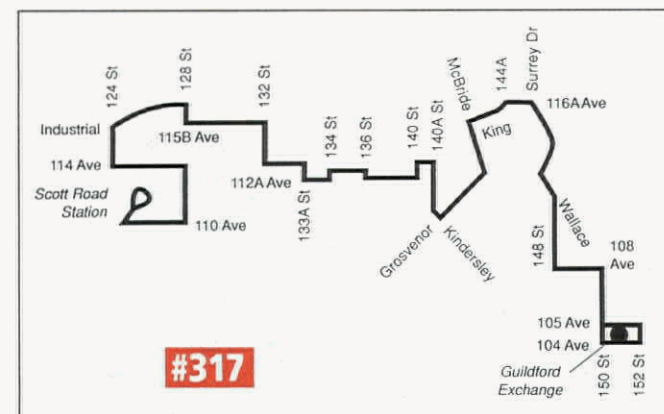
Surrey, North Delta, White Rock & Langley

311 Scottsdale Mall/Vancouver

Service will be discontinued and replaced with a revised #329 route.

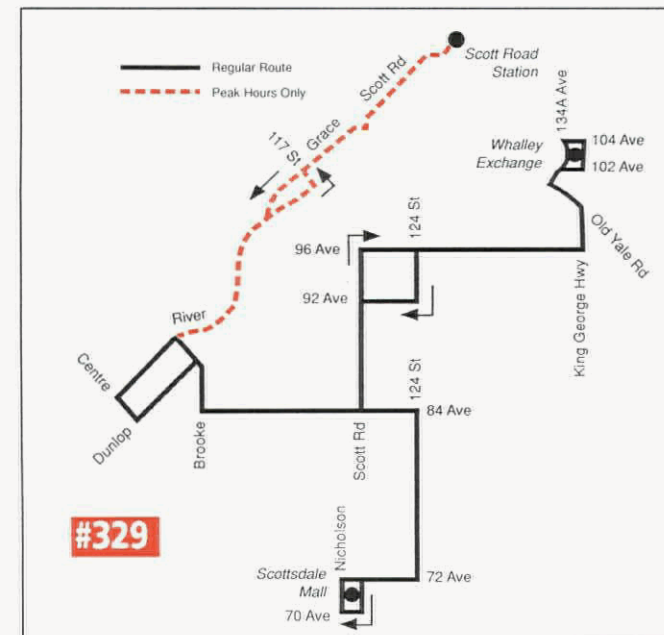


317 Guildford/Scott Road Station

321 White Rock Centre/Scott Road Station ♿

#390 trips leaving White Rock Centre at 5:30 am and 5:10 pm will be replaced by #321 trips. #390 trips leaving Scott Road Station at 6:35 am and 6:13 pm will be replaced by #321 trips at 6:24 am and 6:04 pm.



329 Whalley Exchange/Sunbury/Scottsdale Mall/Scott Road Station

The route will be revised to provide peak period service to Scott Road Station via Sunbury and River Road. Midday trips, Monday to Saturday, will be extended to Sunbury and Scottsdale Mall to replace the discontinued #314 and #317 services.
