

## Morning bus riders move to the front of the line on Lougheed Hwy.

Westbound passengers travelling through Pitt Meadows on the Lougheed Highway can look forward to faster trips, thanks to a new bus lane now partially in service. The 1.5 kilometre stretch from Harris Road to Pallot Creek is the first section of a 2.9 kilometre bus lane that is expected to save BC Transit and private commuter bus passengers as much as five minutes during the morning rush hour. Completion of the remaining section of the lane from Pallot Creek to Dewdney Trunk Road is scheduled for the Spring of 1994.

The bus lane enables buses to "queue-jump", bypassing heavy traffic and re-entering the main road ahead of other vehicles. When completed, the Lougheed Highway bus lane will terminate at Dewdney Trunk Road where a special bus-activated priority signal will allow buses to proceed through the intersection before other vehicles.

BC Transit's 701 Vancouver service (701 Coquitlam Centre during off-peak hours) uses the bus lane every 15 minutes during the morning rush hours and every 30 minutes for the rest of the service day. Ridership will be monitored to see if increased frequency is warranted.

BC Transit Chair Eric Denhoff says this new lane is one of 22 special transit priority measures (bus lanes, signals, access ramps) now in service in the Lower Mainland: BC Transit customers can look forward to more; another 15 transit priority projects are at the planning, design or construction stage.

In addition to getting you to and from work, any valid FareCard is good for unlimited travel throughout the system during non-peak hours and it's transferable to another member of the family or a friend. On books of ten FareSaver tickets you'll save from \$1.25 to \$2. For \$4.50 a DayPass gets you one day's unlimited travel throughout the system from 9:30 am weekdays and all day Saturday, Sunday and holidays. Scratch & Ride DayPasses can be purchased in advance at your nearby FareDealer.

People who qualify for Concession\* fares can purchase a FareCard offering unlimited travel at any time for only \$31.

\*Children 5-13, Secondary students 14-19 with GoCard, Seniors 65+ with proof of age, and HandyPass holders.

Transit passes and tickets are sold at 7-Elevens, Safeways, Ticketmasters, all Bank of Nova Scotia branches (FareCards only), credit unions, convenience stores, drug stores, etc. where you see the FareDealer sign.

## Winter service updates, effective December 13

### VANCOUVER AND BURNABY

#### 1 Gastown/Beach

The last trip leaving Waterfront Station will now be at 6:27 pm. Alternative service is available on the #22 along Burrard and on the #8 on Hastings to Davie Street

#### 3 Main/Robson 8 Fraser/Davie

Schedules throughout the day adjusted slightly

#### 4 Powell/UBC

Schedule throughout the day adjusted slightly to provide better service to UBC

#### 7 Nanaimo Station/Dunbar

Mid-morning, weekday schedules will be adjusted slightly

#### 9 Boundary/Alma/UBC

Mid-day Saturday, Sunday and holiday schedules adjusted slightly

#### 19 Metrotown Station/Stanley Park

Because of the volume of traffic on the Stanley Park Causeway, the left turn from Georgia to Chilco Loop will be discontinued and service will be rerouted via Alberni, between Denman and Chilco. From Monday to Friday, trolley buses will not make the entire trip to Stanley Park. Renamed the **19 Downtown**, trolley-buses will loop downtown via Pender, Howe, Dunsmuir, Burrard and Pender. Passengers travelling to Stanley Park should transfer to the **19 Stanley Park** shuttle bus on Pender at Granville. Service to Stanley Park on weekends and holidays will not require this transfer.

#### 25 Brentwood/UBC

Following morning and afternoon peak periods, service frequency will be reduced from 12 to 15 minutes.

#### 31 Broadway Station/UBC

On some morning peak period trips to UBC, passengers will enjoy the more comfortable ride provided by an articulated bus. The last trip from UBC will leave five minutes later, at 6:15 pm.

#### 41 Joyce Station/UBC

Mid-day, Sunday and holiday schedules will be adjusted slightly.

#### 49 Metrotown Station/Dunbar Loop/UBC

Before and after peak periods, service frequency will be reduced from every 10-12 minutes to every 15 minutes.

#### Route Revisions

#### 144 SFU/Metrotown Station

Some morning peak period trips will operate express service from Metrotown to SFU in order to meet the customers' requests for faster service to the university. (See the #133)

#### New Service

#### 133 SFU Express

Leaving Metrotown at 7:47, 8:40 and 9:40 am weekdays, buses will provide local service between Metrotown Station and Canada Way at Kensington Avenue, then express to SFU Transit Exchange with pick-up only at Gagliardi Way and Lougheed Highway.

Evening and Sunday/holiday schedules will be adjusted to provide better connections with the 420/421 at Knight and Marine.
