

## Boxing Day SeaBus sailing carried 60 millionth passenger

Since its first revenue service trip on June 17, 1977, SeaBus has provided safe, reliable service for over 60 million passengers travelling between Vancouver and North Vancouver: an annual average of over 3.6 million. It has also been a catalyst for development on both sides of Burrard Inlet. Since day one, SeaBus has been popular with all kinds of passengers. In addition to commuters, riders have included skiers, hikers, sightseers, shoppers and cyclists. Since September 1992, bicycles have been allowed on board during rush hours, and the number of cyclists using SeaBus has increased considerably. The figure for the year-ending March 31, 1993 was 31,280.

## Schedule adjustment 501 Langley South/Scott Road Stn

Effective January 2, #501 Sunday and holiday mid-day trips from Scott Road Station will be adjusted to improve schedule reliability. The trip currently scheduled to leave at 11:38 am will leave at 11:36 am and all trips, up to and including the trip scheduled at 6:26 pm, will leave 2 minutes earlier. They will then follow the regular schedule until the end of service. Departure times from Langley South Terminal at 40 Avenue and 208 Street will not change.

Due to safety concerns, the left turn lane from Lougheed Highway to the Coquitlam Centre Transit Exchange has been eliminated and buses are now routed via Lougheed Highway, Barnet, Mariner Way and the access road to the exchange. The heavy traffic flow to Coquitlam Centre during the Christmas shopping period has created some delays for passengers on these services. We are working with the Ministry of Transportation and Highways to reduce the waiting time for buses at the Lougheed and Barnet intersection and apologize for any inconvenience in the interim.

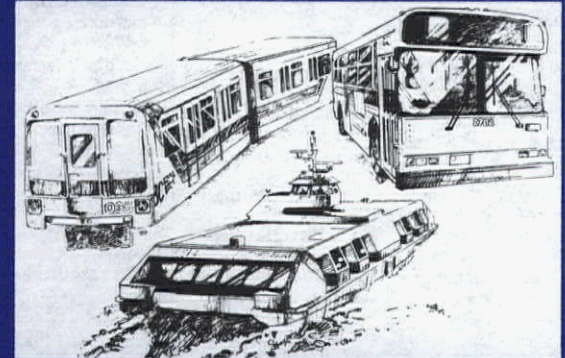

## FareCards

A one-zone FareCard ( \$54) is valid for unlimited rides within one zone during rush hours and across all zones at other times. For college and university students with a valid ID card bearing a Fast Trax sticker, it's good for unlimited travel throughout the system at any time.

A two-zone FareCard (\$82) is valid for unlimited rides in two selected zones during rush hours and across all zones at other times.

A three-zone FareCard (\$106) is valid for unlimited rides throughout the system at any time.

A Concession FareCard\* (\$33) is valid for unlimited rides throughout the system at any time.

## FareSavers

FareSavers in books of 10 offer savings and convenience.

One zone FareSavers \$13.75. Two zone FareSavers \$20.50.

Three zone FareSavers \$28.

## DayPasses

A DayPass (\$4.50) is good for one day's unlimited travel after 9:30 am on weekdays and all Saturday, Sunday and holidays.
