Transit service and safety improvements approved by the VRTC

BC Transit proposals for customer service and safety improvements, using surplus Vancouver Regional Transit Commission funds, have won the support of the Commission.

The improvements include:

- the installation of additional customer security equipment at SkyTrain stations and bus exchanges, such as security mirrors, outside surveillance systems, emergency telephones and better lighting.
- the placing of 500 additional InfoTube timetable displays at bus stops to minimize passenger waiting times.
- the introduction of "Rapid Bus" service between Lougheed Mall and UBC, via Lougheed Highway and Broadway, with stops limited to major transfer points. This new express service will significantly improve travel times by reducing the number of local stops and by eliminating transfers at Brentwood Mall and Boundary Loop.
- the purchase of 20 new minibuses to provide service on lower volume routes in residential neighbourhoods, developing areas, and areas that are difficult to access with 40-foot buses (Westminster Quay, for example).

These improvements will cost approximately \$400,000 in 1994/95 and \$1.6 million per year for the next four years. The money will come from surplus funds placed in the VRTC's Local Transit Fund.

BC Transit chair and CEO, Eric Denhoff, said "each recommendation is based on input from transit customers and from the community and is being implemented with them in mind."

The first step in implementing the service and safety improvements will be to seek an amendment to the provincial transit funding formula to enable the Commission to fully fund the improvements.

Taking a turn for the better

To make it possible for more passengers to ride SkyTrain during the busiest times of the day, there will be some minor changes to service from Vancouver. Some trains will not make the entire trip. "Short turning" is a common practice on both train and bus routes of major city transit systems to provide the maximum service where it's needed most.

In the morning (approx.6:45 to 8:15 am) one out of every two trains from Vancouver will terminate at New Westminster Station. If you are travelling to Surrey City Centre, every other train will go to the end of the line. Those trains that continue all the way through to King George Station will be identified by the overhead electronic (LED) signs on station platforms. If you should board a train that terminates at New Westminster Station, just wait a few minutes and board the next train.

In the afternoon (approx.3:30 to 5:15 pm) one in three trains from Vancouver will terminate at Metrotown Station.

If you are travelling to Surrey City Centre, those trains that continue all the way through to King George Station will be identified by the overhead electronic (LED) signs on station platforms. If you should board a train that terminates at Metrotown Station, but wish to continue to a station beyond, simply wait for a few minutes and board the next train.

Please remember to check the overhead electronic (LED) sign for a train's destination.



Interim Surrey bus changes

You will be able to use the three new stations beginning March 28, but bus service will continue to operate to Scott Road Station until April 10. The bus service integration has been planned for April 11th to allow for a smoother transition for customers, with bus service to Scott Road Station available in the event of service disruptions.

The following minor adjustments to service for the period March 28-April 10 will enable you to transfer to and from the new SkyTrain stations:

•The new 11-bay transit exchange at Surrey Central Station will go into service. All routes that formerly terminated at Whalley Exchange will show Surrey Central Station as their destination.
