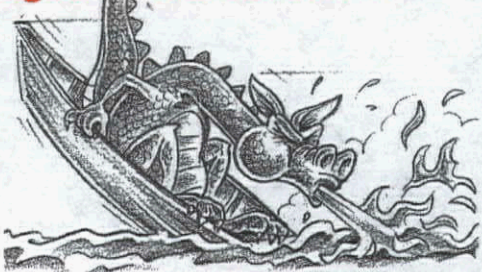

Surrey, North Delta, Langley & White Rock

A one year bicycle rack project will commence on July 1, for trips operating between Vancouver Airport and the Tsawwassen Ferry Terminal (From first trip until approximately 8 pm). The rack on the front of each bus can carry two bicycles. Riders may join or leave the bus at one of five stops: Vancouver Airport, Richmond Exchange, the northbound and southbound stops just north of the Massey Tunnel, Ladner Exchange or Tsawwassen Ferry Terminal. Since the number of bicycles that can be carried is limited, they will be accepted on a first come basis.

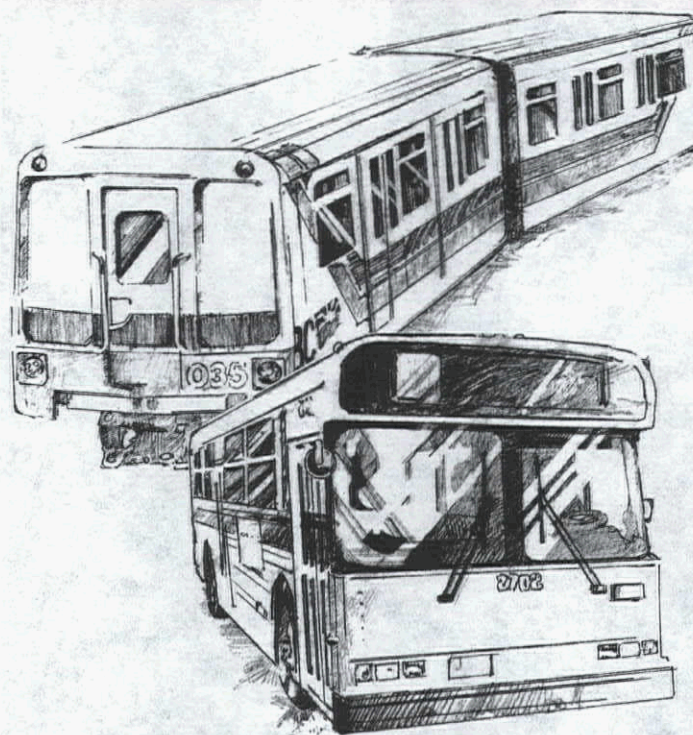

Summer is in swing and BC Transit is updating its services in the Lower Mainland to meet seasonal demand. Highlights include the introduction of three new accessible routes in Surrey, the launch of a bicycle rack service between the Airport and the Tsawwassen Ferry Terminal, the extension of Grouse Mountain service to provide buses year-round, additional service to Horseshoe Bay and peak period service improvements in the north-east sector.

North & West Vancouver

SeaBus

Service will be increased for summer. On Sundays and holidays from July 12 to September 5, service will be provided every 15 minutes between the following times:

From Lonsdale Quay 11:00 am to 6:00 pm

From Waterfront Station 11:15 am to 6:15 pm

214 Blueridge/Phibbs Exchange/Vancouver ♿

The 7:30 am trip from Sechelt at Hyannis will operate only to Phibbs Exchange. For service to Vancouver, transfer to the #210 or #211.

226 St. Patricks/Lonsdale Quay ♿

This service will no longer operate between Pemberton Heights and Lonsdale Quay. Service to/from Pemberton Heights and the W.E.Lucas Centre is available on the #236. During the summer months service will start 15 minutes earlier and end 15 minutes later, with an additional trip at 5:30 pm.

232 Phibbs Exchange/Edgemont Village/Grouse Mountain ♿

Some trips will short turn at Capilano Suspension Bridge where passengers can transfer to the #236 to continue their trips.

236 Lonsdale Quay/Pemberton Heights/Grouse Mountain ♿

Service to Grouse Mountain will now be provided year-round. Service will start at 6:30 am and operate every half hour throughout the summer. Service to the W.E.Lucas Centre will be discontinued for the summer.

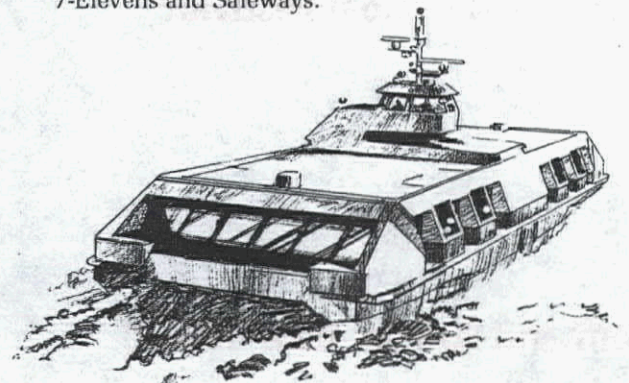

- The #701 will be express from Coquitlam Centre to Vancouver and will operate with articulated buses on some trips. An extra trip will leave downtown at 3:35 pm.
- Some #701 trips will operate as a #190 between Coquitlam Centre and Vancouver.

- #160, #190 and #701 peak period schedules will be revised to balance passenger loads, reduce crowding and provide more reliable connections at Coquitlam Centre.
