
Weekends and holidays, April 1 - October 29



Beginning April 1, a 52 Around the Park lift-equipped bus will leave Stanley Park's Chilco Loop every hour, on the hour, from 10 am to 7 pm, Saturdays, Sundays and holidays. Additional service will be provided when fine weather and special events create greater demand.

From Chilco Loop buses will travel via Alberni, Denman, Morton, Beach, Stanley Park Drive, North Lagoon Drive, Stanley Park Drive, North Lagoon Drive, Georgia, Chilco and into the Loop. Regular fares and transfers apply.

To get to the park by transit on weekends and holidays, take the 19 Stanley Park which operates from Metrotown Station via Central Blvd, Willingdon, Kingsway, Main, Pender, Georgia, Pipeline, Causeway and Chilco, to Chilco Loop.

Artquake at Granville Island Free #51 service, April 8 & 9 &

On Saturday and Sunday, April 8 and 9, Granville Island will be vibrating with visual and performing artists during ArtQuake - a two-day fair showcasing Vancouver's professional arts community. Over 70 of the city's finest cultural organizations representing hundreds of artists will take up tents along Cartwright Street, bringing it alive with street theatre, face painting, food kiosks, dance, open rehearsals. music and more. Many companies will be holding free draws, demonstrations and fun hands-on activities. Throughout the two days, 51 Granville Island buses, operating from Broadway at Granville, will offer fare-free service. Transfers will not be issued.

BC Transit and ICBC join forces to fight vehicle crime at **Scott Road Park & Ride**

ICBC and BC Transit will shortly implement a one-month pilot project to confront the issue of vehicle thefts and breakins at the Scott Road Park & Ride. ICBC will fund full-time bicycle patrols of the lot during the day when most vehicle crimes occur.

The cost of the one-month program is estimated at \$15,000. ICBC estimates it would normally pay about \$41,000 in claims arising out of incidents at the lot during the same period.

At the end of the trial period, the effectiveness of the bicycle patrols will be evaluated and it will be decided if they should continue or some other form of daytime security would be more appropriate.



Spring is in the air and BC Transit's thoughts have turned to the service changes that will meet your local and regional travel needs in the coming months.

Highlights include the re-introduction of service around Stanley Park and the extension of service to White Pine Beach at Sasamat Lake. For those wishing to get to and from Tsawwassen Ferry Terminal there's the extended #404 service with bike rack-equipped buses.

#404 buses, which normally operate between the Airport and Ladner Exchange, will extend their service to the Tsawwassen Ferry Terminal until Labour Day.

601 South Delta/Vancouver

On Sundays and holidays, the trip now leaving 2nd Ave & 52A St at 11:01 pm will leave five minutes earlier, at 10:56 pm, and will leave Ladner Exchange at 11:20 pm.

640 Surrey Central Station/Scott Road Station/Tsawwassen Ferry Terminal

With the 11 pm ferry to Nanaimo leaving earlier, at 10:45 pm, the #640 trip that presently leaves Surrey Central Station daily at 9:46, Scott Road Station at 9:57 and Ladner Exchange at 10:30 pm will now leave at 9:41, 9:52 and 10:19 respectively, arriving at the Ferry Terminal at 10:34 pm.
