

## Victoria Day service

Bus and SeaBus services will operate on Sunday schedules on Victoria Day, May 22. SkyTrain, however, will begin one hour earlier than on a Sunday.

**From King George Station,** the first SkyTrain will leave at 7:08 am. The last through trip to Waterfront Station will leave at 11:38 pm. Later trips as far as New Westminster Station will leave King George until 12:28 am.

**From Waterfront Station,** the first SkyTrain will leave at 7:50 am. The last will leave at 12:15 am.

Single zone fares apply system-wide on holidays and a DayPass or valid FareCard will allow unrestricted travel throughout the day.

## Route change

## 26 Joyce Station / 29th Ave Station

To address safety concerns about southbound #26 buses on Doman Street turning left on to 49th Avenue, they have been rerouted via Tyne Street.

From the east terminus at Joyce Station, buses now travel via Joyce, 45th Avenue, and Tyne Street to 49th Avenue and the regular route.

From the west terminus at 29th Avenue Station, buses now follow the regular route to Boundary, then travel via 49th Avenue, Tyne Street, 45th Avenue and Joyce.

**#51 service to Granville Island every day, beginning Victoria Day**

From Victoria Day to October 9, Granville Island Market will be open seven days a week and the 51 Granville Island service will operate daily. The first bus leaves Broadway at Granville at 8:20 am weekdays and 9:05 am weekends and holidays. The last bus leaves Granville Island at 6:20 pm.

## Elevator at Main Street Station out of service for 2 weeks

Because of construction work on the adjacent VanCity building, the Main Street SkyTrain station elevator will be out of service for approximately two weeks, from Monday, May 29. Passengers who cannot use the stairs or escalator are asked to use the elevator at Stadium Station. A special wheelchair-accessible taxi shuttle will be available to take them to or from Main Street Station.

On arrival at Stadium Station by SkyTrain, passengers should speak to a SkyTrain attendant or use any emergency (red) telephone on the platform, in the elevator or on the ticket concourse level.

Those wishing to travel from Main Street Station to Stadium Station should speak to an attendant at street level.

It is hoped that the elevator will be back in service by Saturday, June 10. Thank you for your patience.

## Bus connections with the Royal Hudson steam train begin June 3

Royal Hudson steam train excursions to Squamish are scheduled to leave the BC Railway Station in North Vancouver at 10:00 am on the following dates:

June	3, 4, 9-11, 14-18, 21-25, 28-30
July	1-3, 5-9, 12-16, 19-23, 26-30
August	2-7, 9-13, 16-20, 23-27, 30, 31

BC Transit will again provide connecting services to and from the station.

**At 9:00 am a bus will leave the Vancouver terminus on Beatty Street, near Stadium Station.** It will pick up additional passengers at a limited number of stops: Georgia at Granville, Burrard and Denman, Marine Drive on the North side of the Lions Gate Bridge, Marine Drive at Capilano and Marine Drive at Pemberton.

*On the return trip to Vancouver, leaving at 4:10 pm, passengers will be able to disembark at any regular stop.*

**At 9:03 am a bus will leave Lonsdale Quay** (9:33 am on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays) and travel non-stop to the station.

*On the return trip to Lonsdale Quay, leaving at 4:10 pm, the bus will travel via Pemberton, Marine Drive and Lonsdale to the Quay. Passengers will be able to disembark at any regular stop.*


Buses enroute to the station will show "Royal Hudson" in the front and side destination panels. Regular fares will apply and transfers will be issued and accepted.

## Pets allowed on transit, Saturday, June 3

The doors will be open at 9 am and judging will commence at 10:30. Between 8 am and 5 pm on the show day, pets may be taken on board buses, SkyTrain and SeaBus providing they are properly restrained in cages or on leashes and controlled by a competent person.
