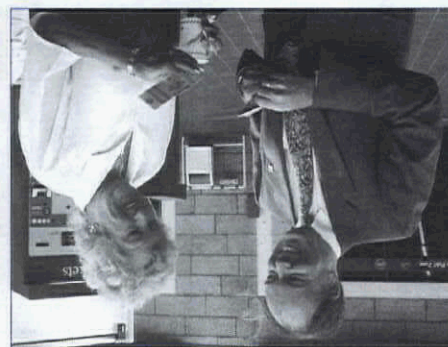

Passengers coming from south of the Oak Street Bridge please remember that two lanes of the bridge will be closed 24 hours a day until September 4. Regular bus services across the bridge are continuing with a few minor route revisions. Northbound riders on Hwy #99 benefit from the bus/HOV lane from Westminster Hwy to the bridge.

If you haven't already done so, you and many other residents of the region will probably want to experience Vancouver's spectacular new library. Summer transit service updates, effective Monday, July 3

Vancouver

9 Boundary/Alma/UBC

With the seasonal decline in ridership to UBC, mid-day trips will terminate at Alma. Mid-day trips to UBC will recommence when fall classes begin, September 4.

19 to Granville/Stanley Park

To meet the increased summer tourist demand between Downtown and Stanley Park, mid-day service will increase to every 10 minutes, Monday through Friday.

25 Brentwood Mall/UBC

With the normal decrease in summer ridership, peak period service will operate every 15 minutes, instead of every 12. 12-minute service will resume with the beginning of classes, September 4.

31 Broadway Station/UBC

To provide sufficient time in the morning and afternoon to travel between UBC Loop and the buildings at the periphery of the campus, the #31 trip that normally leaves Broadway Station at 7:50 am will leave five minutes earlier, at 7:45 am. The trips that normally leave UBC at 4:05 and 5:10 pm will leave five minutes later, at 4:10 and 5:15 pm.

42 Spanish Banks/Chancellor

From July 1 to September 4, the #42 service will operate on Sundays and holidays. Buses will leave UBC Botanical Gardens at 8:33 am and every 60 minutes 'til 6:33 pm. They will leave Spanish Banks Loop at 9 am and every 60 minutes 'til 6 pm.

49 Metrotown Station/Dunbar Loop

With the normal summer decrease in ridership, peak hour service will operate every 12 minutes instead of the normal 10. 12-minute service will recommence with fall classes, September 4.

50 False Creek South/Gastown

With increased mid-day Sunday and holiday tourist traffic on SeaBus and Lonsdale buses, #50 service on the Vancouver side will be increased to operate every 15 minutes from Waterfront Station, 11:21 am to 6:21 pm. Before and after this period, buses will follow the regular schedule.

Richmond, Ladner & Tsawwassen

#401 and 407 services

#411 service

To respond to overcrowding in the morning peak period, a 401 Vancouver trip will be converted to operate as a 411 Vancouver. #407 departures will be adjusted to balance loads and departure times with the #401 from Richmond Exchange.

404 Airport/Ladner Exchange/Tsawwassen Ferry

To meet peak customer demand to and from Tsawwassen Ferry Terminal, some #404 trips between Ladner Exchange and the ferry terminal will be re-scheduled to operate at the same times as the #604. This will provide two buses instead of one. Both the #404 and #640 operate from Bay #1 at Ladner Exchange.

606 Ladner Ring

During the p.m. peak period, #606 buses from Downtown will operate as 601 Ladner Exchange, with Ladner Ring on the side signs, to help alleviate the overcrowding on the #601 to Ladner Exchange. They will then leave Ladner Exchange as 606 Ladner Ring.

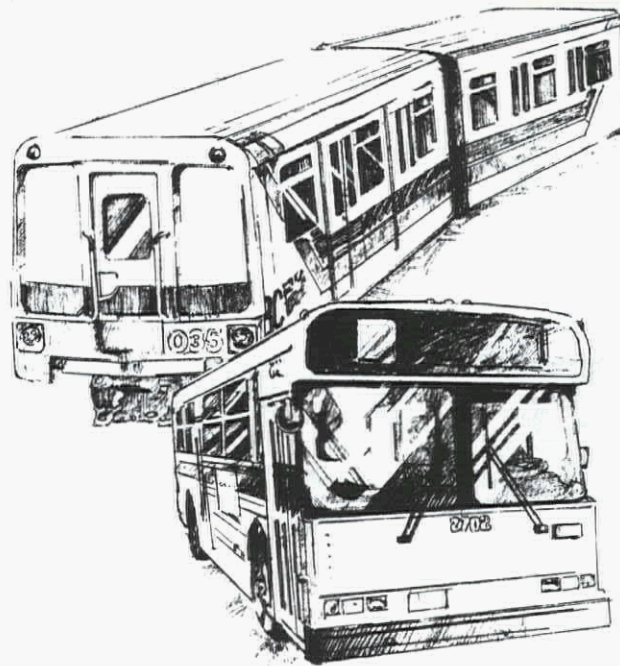
608 Vancouver

For consistency during the a.m. peak period, 608 Vancouver trips will operate as 608 Ladner Ring, then leave Ladner Exchange as 601 Vancouver.

Port Coquitlam

151 Port Coquitlam Centre/Vancouver

Because of lower passenger demand in the summer, one morning peak trip operating between Lougheed Mall and downtown Vancouver will be discontinued. On Sundays and holidays #151 and #152 routes will be permanently changed to terminate all westbound trips at Burrard Station.



Bike Rack service on three routes

The Bike rack pilot project, already on the #404 route, will be expanded to include the #351 and #601 routes through the Massey Tunnel, beginning July 3. Rack-equipped buses will be able to carry two adult bicycles. Panniers and all other luggage must be removed from the bicycles. Rack-equipped trips are indicated on the timetable with a B. Please note that the South Surrey Park & Ride lot is the last unload stop, not White Rock as indicated in the public timetables.

351 Vancouver/Crescent Beach

Cyclists will be able to use the following stops: Burrard Station, Hudson & Marine Drive, Massey Exchange, Matthews Exchange @ Hwy #10, King George Hwy @ Crescent, South Surrey Park & Ride (last unload stop), Crescent Beach Terminus (load only).

Please note that the #351 trip leaving Burrard Station at 5:03 pm, will not be bike-rack equipped as indicated in the public timetable.

601 Vancouver/South Delta

Cyclists will be able to use the following stops: Burrard Station (Bay #3), Hudson & Marine Drive, Massey Exchange, Ladner Exchange, 56th Ave at Hwy 17, South Delta Rec Centre, Pebble Hill Terminus. The normal procedures for pick-up and discharge of passengers apply: For example, in Vancouver loading only in the southbound direction, and unloading only in the northbound direction.

160 Port Coquitlam Centre/Vancouver

Because of lower passenger demand in the summer, one morning and one evening peak will be discontinued. To offset the reduced number of trips, some trips currently using standard buses will use articulated buses.

The #160 route on Sundays and holidays will be permanently changed to terminate all westbound trips at Burrard Station. Alternate eastbound trips will terminate at Coquitlam Centre. An earlier trip on Sundays and holidays will arrive in downtown Vancouver prior to 8 am.

161 South Port Coquitlam/Port Coquitlam Centre

163 Prairie/Port Coquitlam Centre

Trip times will be adjusted to operate one half hour from previously scheduled times.

Surrey, North Delta, Langley, White Rock

320 Surrey Central Station/Fleetwood/Langley Centre

To provide additional Sunday and holiday service to Cloverdale and Langley from Surrey Central Station, two morning trips will be extended from Fleetwood to Langley. This will provide service to Langley one hour earlier than at present and will begin 30-minute service one hour earlier.

321 Surrey Central Station/Newton Exch/White Rock Centre

390 Surrey Central Stn/White Rock Ctr

Service will be revised to operate the first morning #390 trip from White Rock Centre at 5:20 as a #321. The existing #321 trip leaving Newton Exchange at 5:42 will be discontinued. Revised service will provide local service to all stops between Newton Exchange and Surrey Central Station and will eliminate service duplication on King George Highway, between Newton and Surrey Central Station.

352 White Rock Centre/Vancouver

Morning peak-period service frequency will be reduced until September 5.

506 Langley Centre/Aldergrove

511 Langley Centre/Aldergrove

Because of revised trip times from Surrey Central Station to Langley Centre, #506 and #511 schedules will be adjusted to ensure connections with the #502 at Langley Centre.

Burrard Station Bay #5

On Sundays and holidays, routes #151, #152 and #160 will terminate at Bay #5 on Thurlow Street.

North & West Vancouver

SeaBus

Service on Sundays and holidays will be provided every 15 minutes from June 25 to September 4 inclusive, between the following times:

From Lonsdale Quay 11:00 am to 6:00 pm
From Waterfront Terminal 11:15 am to 6:15 pm.

214 Phibbs Exchange/Vancouver

An extra morning peak period trip to downtown Vancouver, leaving Phibbs Exchange at 8:17 am on weekdays, will be provided to address added passenger demand.

230 Upper Lonsdale/Lonsdale Quay

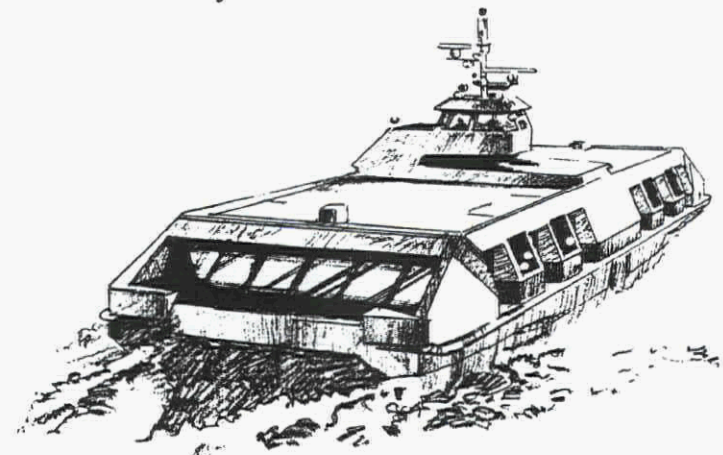
Increased #230 service on Sundays and holidays will combine with the regular #229/230 service to provide a bus every 15 minutes on Lonsdale and a connection with every SeaBus sailing.

236 Lonsdale Quay/Pemberton Heights/Grouse Mountain

Service to Grouse Mountain will be provided every 30 minutes. Service to the W.E. Lucas Centre for Continuing Education will be discontinued for the summer.

257 Horseshoe Bay/Vancouver

Beginning June 26, service will be improved to provide connections with additional BC Ferry sailings to and from Horseshoe Bay.
