

Who is eligible for a GoCard?
 High school students who:
 • live within the school service area
 • are 14 to 19 years old (inclusive) or are in Grade 8 at the start of the school year
 • attend classes full time at a public or private school - Grades 8 to 12 (inclusive)
 are eligible to apply for GoCards that entitle them to pay Concession fares on the Vancouver Regional Transit System. The student must carry and be able to show his/her GoCard or pay the adult fare.
Getting a GoCard is easy
 A GoCard strip transforms an ordinary student I.D. card into a GoCard. The necessary photograph will be taken at an in-school photography session and the card will be issued approximately two weeks later.
 There is no charge for GoCards issued as a result of these in-school sessions -- so make certain you don't miss yours.
In the meantime...
 students with 1994/95 GoCards who are still attending secondary schools can use them until October 31, 1995. If a GoCard has been lost over the summer it should be replaced immediately by calling your school.
 New Grade 8 students can pay a Concession fare without a GoCard until October 31, 1995. These students should advise the driver of their age, grade and school when boarding. If they encounter any problem, they are advised to pay the adult fare and note the time of travel, the bus number and operator number and call BC Transit Customer Relations at 540-3040.
If you miss the school photo session...
 You will pay a \$5 fee to have a GoCard produced.
 You may go to Photo Ident, 5317 Lane Street, Burnaby (near Royal Oak SkyTrain Station, or to Mountain West Studios, 10733 Roosevelt Crescent, North Vancouver. In either case, the hours are 9 am to 4:30 pm, Monday to Friday. No appointment is necessary.
 GoCard photography sessions will also be provided by Apple Photographic Services from October 21 to December 5 in a mobile unit that travels to locations throughout Greater

Concession fares for Grade 8 to 12 students with GoCards

Remember...your GoCard cannot be used by anyone else
 If the photograph on a GoCard doesn't match the face of the user, the GoCard will be confiscated. It's important to remember that misuse of a GoCard is obtaining transportation by fraud -- a criminal offence.
 A student leaving the school system must return his/her GoCard to the school principal.
Concession fares
 Cash, Concession tickets or Concession FareCards can be used to pay fares:

Rush hours .75	\$1.10	\$1.50
Monthly FareCard (unlimited travel)	\$33.00	\$33.00

Post-secondary students can have unlimited travel with a one-zone FareCard
 With a Fast Trax Transit Strip attached to their student I.D.'s, post-secondary students can travel throughout the system anytime on a regularly priced adult, one-zone monthly FareCard (\$54). The strip is available at both I.D. and FareCard must be shown when boarding and when requested.

Early SkyTrain start
Labour Day holiday service
 As usual, most BC Transit services will operate on Sunday schedules on Monday, September 4. Please note, however, that SkyTrain service will begin one hour earlier.

 A lift-equipped bus leaves Stanley Park Loop every hour, on the hour, from 10 am to 7 pm. Regular fares apply. Accessible stops show the wheelchair decal.

How to get to the Vancouver Indy

Pedals to the metal or take transit!



The Vancouver Indy returns to Concord Pacific Place, September 1, 2 and 3. The streets around BC Place will be converted into a 2.78 km circuit to host this city's only major league auto race - Indy Car style!

Transit is your best route to the Indy. SkyTrain will race you to Stadium and Science World-Main Street Station...both close to the track. Buses throughout the Lower Mainland connect with stations all along the route and SeaBus connects with Waterfront Station. Check your tickets in advance to identify you most convenient entrance and transit service.

- **For Pit Suites, Start/Finish Suites, Start/Finish Boxes, False Creek Chalet and Grandstands 2, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 & 24:** use the **Quebec Street entrance** (north of Science World): Ride SkyTrain to Main Street Station or take the #3, 8 or 19 bus along Main Street to Terminal Avenue and walk.
- **For VIP Hospitality Tent, Hairpin Chalet and Grandstands 18, 19, 21, 22, 23 & 25, use Stadium Plaza entrance (Terry Fox Plaza):** Ride SkyTrain to Stadium Station and walk 2 blocks south along Beatty Street, or take a regular #3, 4, 7, 8, 10, 14, 16, 20 or 50 and walk about 7 blocks along Robson Street from Granville Mall.

Additional service, Sunday, Sept 3
 SkyTrain will begin operating two hours earlier. The first train will leave King George Station at 6:08 am, arriving at Stadium Station at approximately 6:43. Additional bus service will be provided on selected major routes to accommodate early morning feeder service to SkyTrain stations.
 SeaBus will sail from Lonsdale Quay at 30 minute intervals, beginning at 8:02 am, with 15 minute service between 10:02 am and 6:02 pm.

Minor reroutes.
 Because of the closure of the Cambie Street Bridge to north-bound traffic, September 1-3, the #15 and 17 Downtown will be rerouted via Broadway and the Granville Bridge to Robson and will then continue on their regular route. Please note that they will operate "Express" from Broadway to Granville & Robson with stops only at major transfer points.







One Zone FareCard change effective September 1

The new One Zone FareCard features three scratch-off panels; one for each fare zone in the Vancouver Regional Transit System. FareCard purchasers will scratch off the panel for the zone in which most of their peak period travel occurs. For travel in additional zones during peak periods, customers must pay an AddFare.

The purpose of the new pass is to make it easier for transit operators to identify the origin of the FareCard holder's trip and see that the appropriate fare is paid during peak periods. It will also reduce the potential for peak period fare evasion at transfer points located at or near Fare Zone boundaries.



Fare Zone Boundary Change at North Road, September 1

Effective September 1, the fare zone boundary between Zone 2 and Zone 3 will be relocated to North Road, the municipal boundary between Burnaby and Coquitlam. Consequently, the fare zone boundary at Gagliardi Way will be removed.

Because of the many bus routes along North Road serving both Burnaby and Coquitlam residents, a Common Fare Zone will be created for bus stops located between Cottonwood and Highway #1 (see map below). Customers boarding at these stops during rush hours may pay a One Zone fare for travel in either Burnaby or Coquitlam. They should ask for a fare receipt/transfer to provide proof of payment when transferring to other buses, SeaBus or SkyTrain. Customers using FareCards in the Common Zone should also ask for a fare receipt/transfer. Remember, AddFares will apply when crossing zone boundaries into Vancouver or Surrey.

An information folder with full details will be available on buses operating in the area.
