Revised route, effective April 10 22 Downtown / Macdonald - 16th Ave



The City of Vancouver will be converting Carrall Street to one way southbound between Pender and Pacific Boulevard South. The terminus for #22 buses will be moved from Carrall to Keefer, west of Columbia. Beginning with the first trip on Monday, April 10, buses leaving the new terminus will travel west on Keefer, north on Abbott and west on Pender to the regular route. Eastbound buses will follow the regular route from 16th Ave & Trutch to Pender at Columbia, then travel south on Columbia and west on Keefer to the new terminus.

Artguake at Granville Island Free #51 service, April 8 & 9

On Saturday and Sunday, April 8 and 9, Granville Island will be vibrating with visual and performing artists during ArtQuake. Throughout the two days, 51 Granville Island buses, operating from Broadway at Granville, will offer farefree service. Transfers will not be issued.

Cycling B.C. Share the Road Safety Clinics

In cooperation with BCAA, Cycling B.C. offers a series of free bicycle safety clinics as part of the 1995 Share the Road campaign. The clinics will cover the basic principles and techniques of safe coexistence of bicycles and cars. **Sessions will be offered at 12:30 pm, 2 pm and 3:30 pm** on each of the following dates:

Saturdays April 8 and 15 at the basketball courts, Kits Beach Park (between Arbutus and the SeaSide bike route). Sunday April 23 at Lonsdale Quay (just east of SeaBus). Saturday April 29 at Pacific Press parking lot, 7th & Hemlock (on the new Off-Broadway Bike Route). Participants are asked to arrive at least 10-15 minutes before the session to register at the reception table. Each session will be limited to 24 people so that all may receive proper attention. All participants must bring a bicycle in good mechanical condition and a helmet. A safety check will be performed during each session before heading out on the

road. Each entrant will have an opportunity to enter a draw for a mountain bike.
