

Get the jump on traffic & parking by taking transit to the Grizzlies

In fact, whatever the event: basketball, ice show, Canucks, or concert, let SeaBus/Bus/SkyTrain whisk you to the new 20,000-seat General Motors Place.

It's fast and inexpensive: travel from any point in the region for a one-zone fare, weeknights after 6:30 and anytime weekends.

Stadium Station's new entrance at the east end of the platform, with stairs leading directly to Pacific Boulevard, provides SkyTrain passengers with the closest access to the *TicketMaster outlet, the Winning Spirit shop and arena gates 3 and 7.*

Or, by using the original entrance at the west end riders can use the new Dunsmuir Viaduct walkway to reach the *mid-level of the arena (gates 2 and 8).* Please note that escalator and elevator service is available only at the Beatty Street entrance.

Bus passengers from the Pender/Hastings/Cordova corridor can reach the arena by walking along the new Abbott Street connector south of Pender. Passengers from the Seymour/Granville/Howe corridor can approach along either Georgia or Dunsmuir Streets, following the new walkways along the viaduct east of Beatty Street.

Use prepaid fares to speed your SkyTrain trip home.

Weekend SkyTrain service adjustments

As mentioned in the October 6 issue of *The Buzzer*, weekend service, October 21/22, between Scott Road and King George Stations will be reduced to approximately every 10 minutes while "heat tracing" cables are installed. Service between Waterfront and Scott Road Stations will not be affected

For Grizzlies', Canucks' and Lions' games, and particularly on occasions like Oct 28 when both the Lions and Canucks are playing, **use prepaid fares to help speed your trip home on SkyTrain**

Ticket machines accept \$2, \$5 and \$10 bills and make change, but you can expect a lineup. FareSavers are faster than cash - just stamp them at the red validator stands inside the station. But FareCards and DayPasses are fastest of all - just show and go!

Extra SkyTrain service will be provided but when a large number of people try to leave at around the same time it naturally takes some time to get everyone on board. Thank you in advance for your patience.



WEST COAST EXPRESS

Service starts November 1

For the first three days, November 1, 2 & 3, there will be five morning and five evening trips between Mission and Vancouver, but buses will continue on their existing routes and schedules.

On November 6, updated bus services with connections at Maple Meadows, Pitt Meadows, Port Coquitlam, Coquitlam, Port Moody and Waterfront stations will commence.

These updated services are detailed in a "Bus Stop" brochure which will be inserted in local newspapers and be available from October 26 on any bus in Coquitlam, Port Coquitlam, Port Moody, Pitt Meadows or Maple Ridge; in libraries, city and municipal halls, chambers of commerce and travel info centres in the northeast sector.

GoCards for Grades 8 to 12

1995/96 GoCards must be shown from November 1

Beginning Wednesday, November 1, new Grade 8 students and students who have been using 1994/95 GoCards, must show 1995/96 GoCards when paying Concession fares on the Vancouver Regional Transit System. Those without the new GoCards must pay an adult fare.

Students who missed the school photo session or have lost their GoCards can obtain one immediately by going to: **Photo Ident, 5317 Lane Street, Burnaby (near Royal Oak SkyTrain Station) or Mountain West Studios, 1073**

Roosevelt Crescent, North Vancouver. The hours are 9:00 am to 4:30 pm, Monday to Friday.

From October 21 to December 5 students have a further option: a mobile unit which will offer photo sessions at locations throughout Greater Vancouver. Locations and dates for the next few weeks are listed below.

When going to Photo Ident, Mountain West Studios or the mobile unit, students will require a GoCard application form (*available at the school office*) signed by a school official, proof of age (*birth certificate or CareCard*) and a \$5 fee. An appointment is not necessary.
