A student leaving the school system must return his/her GoCard to the school principal. If the photograph on a GoCard doesn't match the face of the user, the GoCard will be confiscated. It's important to remember that misuse of a GoCard is obtaining transportation by fraud -- a criminal offence.

GoCard photography sessions will also be provided by Apple Photographic Services from October 26 to December 10 in a mobile unit that travels to locations throughout Greater Vancouver. Watch for details of dates and places. * Students going to Photo Ident, Mountain West Studios or Apple Photographic Services must have a GoCard application form (available at the school office) signed by a school official, proof of age (birth certificate or passport) and a \$5 fee. You may go to Photo Ident, 5317 Lane Street, Burnaby, (near Royal Oak SkyTrain Station) Phone 434-1321, or to Mountain West Studios, 1073 Roosevelt Crescent, North Vancouver, Phone 980-8551. *Appointments are recommended.* Photo Ident's hours (year round) are 1:30 pm to 4:30 pm, Monday and Friday, and 9:00 am to 1 pm on Wednesday. Mountain West Studios' hours are 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, Monday to Friday.

In the meantime...

secondary schools can use them until October 31, 1996. If a GoCard has been lost over the summer it should be replaced immediately by calling your school. New Grade 8 students can pay a Concession fare without a GoCard until October 31, 1996. These students should inform the driver of their age, grade and school when boarding. If they encounter any problem, they are advised to pay the adult fare and note the time of travel and the bus number, and call BC Transit Customer Relations at 540-3040.

Getting a GoCard is easy

High school students who:
• live within the school service area
• are 14 to 19 years old (inclusive) or are in Grade 8 at the start of the school year
• attend classes full time at a public or private school - Grades 8 to 12 (inclusive)
are eligible to apply for GoCards that entitle them to pay Concession fares on the Vancouver Regional Transit System. The student must carry and be able to show his/her GoCard or pay the adult fare.

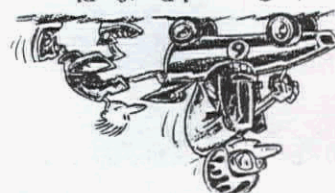

Additional service, Sunday September 1
SkyTrain will begin operating two hours earlier. The first train will leave King George Station at 6:08 am, arriving at Stadium Station at approximately 6:43. Additional bus service will be provided on selected major routes to accommodate passengers wishing to connect with earlier SkyTrain service. Seabus will leave Lonsdale Quay every 30 minutes from 7:02 to 11:02 am; then every 15 minutes to 6:02 pm. **Minor reroutes** Because of the closure of the Cambie Street Bridge to northbound traffic, August 30, 31 and September 1, the #15 and 17 Downtown will be rerouted via Broadway and the Granville Bridge to Robson, and will then continue on their regular route. Please note that they will operate "Express" from Broadway to Granville & Robson with stops only at major transfer points.

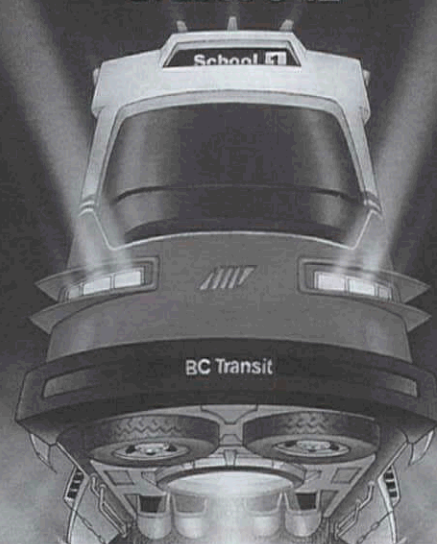

Fall transit service updates, effective Monday, September 2

It's time to head back to school and work, and BC Transit will be making service adjustments to meet your travel needs. Highlights include reinstatement of regular services to the UBC and SFU campuses and peak-period service that had been discontinued for summer. Read also about the new, faster, limited-stop 99 B-Line

Minor schedule or route adjustments:

Morning peak-period service levels will be adjusted slightly.

9 Boundary/Broadway Station/Alma/UBC

With the introduction of the 99 B-Line, #9 peak-period service will be reduced slightly. Mid-day trips will continue to terminate at Alma, as in summer.

15 Cambie/Downtown

Morning peak-period service to downtown will be increased.

17 Oak/Downtown

Morning peak-period service will be increased.

19 Metrotown Station/Downtown/Stanley Park

Monday to Friday mid-day service between downtown and Stanley Park will be provided every 15 minutes. Service to the upper zoo area of Stanley Park will be discontinued until next summer.
