GoCards for Grades 8 to 12

If you have missed the school photo session...

you will pay a \$5 fee to have a GoCard produced. Photography sessions are available now at Photo Ident and Mountain West Studios (see addresses and requirements below)

Students with 1995/96 GoCards who are still attending secondary schools can use them until October 31, 1996. If a GoCard has been lost over the summer it should be replaced immediately by going to:

Photo Ident, 5317 Lane Street, Burnaby (near Royal Oak SkyTrain station) Phone 434-1321. or to Mountain West Studios, 1073 Roosevelt Crescent, North Vancouver, Phone 980-8551. Appointments are recommended. Photo Ident's hours (year round) are 1:30 pm to 4:30 pm, Monday and Friday, and 9 am to 1 pm on Wednesday. Mountain West Studios' hours are 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, Monday to Friday.

Bring along a GoCard application form (available at the school office) signed by a school official, proof of age (birth certificate or passport) and a \$5 fee.

New Grade 8 students can pay a Concession fare without a GoCard until October 31, 1996. These students should inform the driver of their age, grade and school when boarding. If they encounter any problem, they are advised to pay the adult fare and note the time of travel and the bus number, and call BC Transit Customer Relations at 540-3040.

Post-secondary students can have unlimited travel with a one-zone FareCard

With a Fast Trax Transit strip attached to their student I.D.'s, post-secondary students can travel throughout the system anytime on a regularly priced adult, one-zone monthly FareCard (\$54). The strip is available at student unions at eligible post-secondary institutions. Both I.D. and FareCard must be shown when boarding and when requested.



The 99 B-Line is a great way to travel during both peak and off-peak hours! Buzzing all day, Monday to Saturday, between Lougheed Mall and UBC in about an hour, it stops at Austin, Brentwood Mall,* Boundary, Broadway Station, Main, Cambie, Willow, Granville, Macdonald and Alma. *(Westbound buses stop at Halifax & Willingdon; eastbound buses at Lougheed & Willingdon). Most of these stops are at major transfer points, so that passengers will have good connections with other routes and services.

If you are presently riding the #9, the #10, the #151/152 or the #109 from/to any of the stops listed above, why not try the B-Line? It's fast and frequent and there's lots of room to ride during non-peak hours.

- The 6:57 am trip from Brentwood Mall has now been extended to UBC. This will get you there for an 8 am work start.





- Travel early...Some buses and trains may be full immediately before the event. Allow yourself some extra time so you can arrive relaxed.
- Move down the aisle...When buses and trains are crowded, please don't block the doors. Move on in so that others may board -- you will appreciate it when others do the same for you.
- Please be patient...We will do our best to get everyone home as quickly as possible.

Pre-pay for a faster trip home on SkyTrain after major events

SkyTrain provides extra service after all major events at General Motors Place and BC Place, but passengers paying cash may be delayed in line-ups at ticket machines or extra fareboxes available for exact fares.

You can avoid cash delays altogether by using FareSavers, a DayPass, or your monthly FareCard. If you still decide to pay by cash, however, SkyTrain will provide you with the opportunity to pre-purchase your "return" fare at Stadium Station during the hour before major events. This will help us streamline your way to the platform after the event and on to a train. Here's how it works:

- ✓ Pay your regular one-way fare to the event we are not able to offer a "round trip" package at this time.
- ✓ On arrival at Stadium Station pre-purchase your return fare from SkyTrain staff only, at a farebox inside the station. Fareboxes will normally be set up at the Pacific Boulevard exit for events at GM Place, and in the Beatty Street Concourse for events at BC Place. Do not pre-purchase at a ticket machine, since those tickets expire 90 minutes after the sale.
- ✓ You will need exact cash for yourself or your group.
- ✓ The transfer/receipt you receive will be valid for at least 90 minutes after the end of the event.
- ✓ Have the transfer/receipt ready for inspection when you return to the station.
- ✓ Please note that transfer/fare receipts are not refundable.

A few more weekends to enjoy transit in Stanley Park

The 52 Around the Park seasonal service operates weekends 'til October 27, plus Thanksgiving Day, October 14. A wheelchair accessible bus leaves Stanley Park Loop every hour, on the hour, from 10 am to 7 pm. The international wheelchair logo identifies accessible stops. Regular fares and transfers apply. 3

Illegal peddling of used tickets and transfers **Reader suggests another** "don't" for our list

In a recent issue of The Buzzer we listed the following things you should do and not do to help us fight the peddling of used tickets and transfers:

- ✓ Please don't sell or give away your used tickets or transfers. Tear them up or make certain they have expired.
- ✓ Don't buy unauthorized fares. They may not be valid and you could be inconvenienced or even face prosecution yourself.
- ✓ Pay only at a farebox, ticket machine or an authorized FareDealer.
- ✓ Be a witness through Crime Stoppers if you have informa tion that could lead to the arrest and conviction of some one involved in fare fraud. Anonymity is guaranteed and you may qualify for a cash reward. Call 669-TIPS.

After reading this, a Vancouver rider kindly wrote and suggested another "don't":

✓ Don't take a transfer if you know for sure that you won't use it. Many will end up on the floor where they can be picked up and reused or resold.

to SkyTrain or SeaBus, it's important that you ask for a transfer (fare receipt) when paying by cash or FareSaver ticket for a multi-zone rush hour trip. When you plan to remain on the same bus for the entire trip, the transfer provides proof of payment when a fare check is conducted at a zone boundary. Without this proof of payment you can be asked to pay an AddFare to cross the zone boundary.
