Upcoming SkyTrain service changes

In response to increasing ridership and passenger feedback, we will shortly introduce two service improvements.

Rush-hour service changes beginning Monday, March 31

All trains will operate the full length of the line between Waterfront and King George Stations during both morning and afternoon peak periods. (At present every second train shortturns at Scott Road). Average frequency will remain at about two and a half minutes. but schedules will be adjusted to more closely match actual travel patterns through the peaks. Trains will be as close as 2 minutes apart at the busiest time of the rush. At the lighter times, intervals between trains will be up to 3 minutes.

This change is designed to produce a more uniform loading of trains through the peak periods, alleviating some of the crowding at the busy times, and to make the most effective use of available equipment. We will be committing 136 (almost 91%) of our 150-car fleet to rush hour service.

The heaviest loads will still be experienced on westbound trains leaving King George between 6:50 and 8:20 am (arriving downtown Vancouver between 7:30 and 9:00), and eastbound leaving downtown between 4:00 and 5:30 pm. If you can travel outside these times, you'll find the trip a little more spacious.

Earlier Sunday morning service beginning April 6

Regular Sunday morning service will start one hour earlier than at present. The first westbound train will leave King George at 7:08 am, arriving at Waterfront at approximately 7:47. The first eastbound train will leave Waterfront at 7:50 am, arriving at King George at about 8:29. Earlier trains leaving the SkyTrain yard will enter eastbound service at Edmonds, starting at 7:22 am. This brings Sunday service in line with the earlier start we have operated on many statutory holidays over the past two years, and will hopefully benefit a number of our riders.

For the Sun Run, Sunday, April 20, service will be advanced a further half hour, with the first train leaving King George at 6:38 am, arriving downtown at about 7:15.

Please note that Sunday and holiday closing times will remain unchanged. Last train for Waterfront leaves King George at 11:38 pm. Last train leaves Waterfront at 12:15 am.






