# Earlier SkyTrains from Waterfront, **Monday to Friday**

Effective March 31, eastbound trains will leave Waterfront Station on weekdays beginning at 5:35 am instead of 5:50, arriving at King George Station at 6:14 am. These early trips currently commence at Broadway, but will now be extended to provide service from the five downtown area stations. Westbound service to downtown Vancouver will not change.

Also starting March 31, alternate rush-hour trips will no longer short-turn at Scott Road; all trips will normally travel the full length of the system between Waterfront and King George stations, every 2-3 minutes.

Starting Sunday, April 6, Sunday service will start one hour earlier. The first trains will leave King George at 7:08 am and Waterfront at 7:50 am. These times will also apply to most statutory holidays.

# North Burnaby changes to watch for when spring service updates are introduced April 14

#### **Montecito and Forest Grove customers**

The new #136 route will provide direct service between Phillips at Coronado and downtown Vancouver during peak periods (see stopping procedure map on page 3).

Meanwhile, the #134 will be rerouted to operate between Lougheed Mall and Brentwood Mall, improving east/west service coverage in the area.

# **Capitol Hill customers**

The **#137** will be rerouted to operate between Capitol Hill and Brentwood Mall, eliminating the need to transfer. Customers destined for Hastings (west of Willingdon) or Vancouver will be able to transfer at Gamma Avenue to the frequent new **#135** (Mon-Sat daytime) and **#136** (peak period) services to downtown Vancouver. See #135 and #136 stopping procedure maps on page 4.

#### New #129 Brentwood Mall/Metrotown Station route

The #110 Lougheed Mall/Metrotown service will be rerouted between Burnaby City Hall and Metrotown. Customers in the Patterson/Moscrop area west of Willingdon, including #28 customers, will be served by the new #129 route, providing direct service between SkyTrain, Burnaby General Hospital and Brentwood Mall. School services will operate via Patterson Avenue and Moscrop Street or via Willingdon.

Service levels on the #110 will be consistent along the entire route (a bus every 20 minutes between Metrotown and Lougheed Mall during the peak periods, for example).

# 130 Metrotown Station/Kootenay Loop

The #130 service will be rerouted to operate on Willingdon Avenue, rather than in the Nelson/Bond area. The rerouted #110 service will operate through the Nelson/Bond area. Customers using the #130 service will be provided with a more direct route between Metrotown, BCIT and Brentwood.

# Moscrop Junior and Burnaby Central school customers

Many of the bus routes in Burnaby will be revised. In the Moscrop area, for instance, regular buses will no longer operate between Patterson Avenue and Willingdon. School Specials will, however, continue to operate as follows:

# Afternoon peak school services

One School Special trip from Burnaby City Hall via Deer Lake Place, Gilpin, Royal Oak, Deer Lake Parkway, Moscrop, Patterson, Sardis, Barker, Grange, Patterson, South Beresford, Willingdon and Central Boulevard to Metrotown Station.

One 110 Metrotown Station trip from Burnaby City Hall Loop via Deer Lake Place, Gilpin, Royal Oak, Deer Lake Parkway, Moscrop, Willingdon, Bond, Nelson, Bennett, Bonsor and Central Boulevard to Metrotown Station.
