

A plan to improve transit for North Burnaby riders, beginning April 14


This plan addresses the needs and concerns of North Burnaby customers by providing direct service from North Burnaby to downtown Vancouver and new or improved connections between local and regional destinations. Some of the key features of the plan:

- Direct bus service along Hastings will be provided by three routes (eliminating many transfers at Kootenay Loop):
- 1.) SFU to downtown Vancouver/Stanley Park
- 2.) New Westminster Station via Canada Way to down town Vancouver
- Montecito area to downtown Vancouver (peak hours)
- **99 B-Line** schedule will be adjusted to provide service every 15 minutes between Brentwood Mall and SkyTrain, Central Broadway and UBC. Watch for more improvements later in 1997.
- A new service will connect Burnaby General Hospital with Patterson Station, Metrotown Station, and with Brentwood Mall.

- Local service to major Burnaby activity centres will be improved.
- Local routes will be oriented north-south, connect ing with Hastings and Broadway/Lougheed services to Vancouver. This will create a more mature grid
   network (similar to that in Vancouver) and increased frequencies will allow for improved transfers at major intersections.
- PNE Park & Ride service (currently every 12 min utes during peak periods by #2 route) will be provided every 5 minutes by suburban services on Hastings Street. #2 route will be discontinued.
- **Direct service** will be provided between the Capitol Hill neighbourhood and Brentwood Mall.
- Increased frequencies will be provided between Lougheed Mall and Burnaby City Hall, and between Metrotown, BCIT and Brentwood Mall.

# Help us plan a new route to serve Pacific Blvd.



In 1997 we'll be enhancing service in downtown Vancouver in two phases.

**Phase 1** will be a new bus route connecting Yaletown and False Creek North with downtown. This could also involve changes to #1 Gastown/Beach.

To get community input into the planning of this route, we are holding a Public Workshop Session on February 24, 7:30 to 9:30 pm in the Peter Kaye Room of Vancouver Public Library, Hamilton & Georgia.

**Phase 2** is proposed to improve the reliability of West End service, and to provide a direct connection between the West End and the growing entertainment district (stadium, library, theatres). Watch for a similar meeting in the spring to discuss Phase 2.

These two new routes are part of the 1997/98 service plan that will expand services by 4% overall, and cost
