

If you miss the school photo session...

You may pay a \$5 fee to have a GoCard produced*. You may go to The Artona Group Inc., 353 West 7th Ave, Vancouver, Phone 872-7272, or to Mountain West Studios, 1073 Roosevelt Crescent, North Vancouver, Phone 980-8551. Appointments are recommended. The Artona Group hours are 10 am to 5:00 pm, Monday to Saturday. Mountain West Studios hours are 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, Monday to Friday. GoCard photography sessions will also be provided by Apple Photographic Services from October 25 to December 9 in a

In the meantime...

Students with 1996/97 GoCards who are still attending secondary schools can use them until October 31, 1997. If a GoCard has been lost over the summer it should be replaced immediately by calling your school. New Grade 8 students can pay a Concession fare without a GoCard until October 31, 1997. These students should inform the driver of their age, grade and school when boarding. If they encounter any problem, they are advised to pay the adult fare and note the time of travel and the bus number, and call BC Transit Customer Relations at 540-3040.

Getting a GoCard is easy

A GoCard strip transforms an ordinary student I.D. card into a GoCard. The necessary photograph will be taken at an in-school photography session and the card will be issued approximately two weeks later.

Who is eligible for a GoCard?

High school students who:

- live within the school service area
- are 14 to 19 years old (inclusive) or are in Grade 8 at the start of the school year
- attend classes full time at a public or private school - Grades 8 to 12 (inclusive)

are eligible to apply for GoCards that entitle them to pay Concession fares on the Vancouver Regional Transit System. The student must carry and be able to show his/her GoCard or pay the adult fare.

Concession fares for Grade 8 to 12 students with GoCards

Good advice from an operator

Service could often be faster if all boarding passengers followed a few simple rules -

- Don't board until you have the correct fare or a valid transfer in your hand. If you start searching your pockets or bag while standing on the platform, you block other passengers trying to board.
- Have any necessary I.D. ready for inspection if you are entitled to travel for a reduced fare.

Post-secondary students can have unlimited travel with a one-zone FareCard

With a Fast Trax Transit Strip attached to their student I.D.'s, post-secondary students can travel throughout the system anytime on a regularly priced adult, one-zone monthly FareCard. The strip is available at student unions at eligible post-secondary institutions. Both I.D. and FareCard must be shown when boarding and when requested.

Remember...your GoCard cannot be used by anyone else

If the photograph on a GoCard doesn't match the face of the user, the GoCard will be confiscated. It's important to remember that the misuse of a GoCard is obtaining transportation by fraud--a criminal offence. A student leaving the school system must return his/her GoCard to the school principal.

It's race weekend again



The big race returns to Concord Pacific Place, August 29, 30 and 31. You can win the race to get there quickly and comfortably by transit...your best route to the track. SkyTrain will take you to Stadium Station or Science World - Main Street Station...both close to the track. Buses throughout the Lower Mainland connect with stations along the route and SeaBus meets SkyTrain at Waterfront Station. Check your tickets in advance to identify your most convenient station and entrance gate.

For Pit Suites, Start/Finish Suites, Start/Finish Boxes, False Creek Chalet and Grandstands 2, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 & 24, use the Quebec Street entrance, north of Science World. Ride SkyTrain to Main Street Station or take the #3, #8 or #19 bus along Main Street to Terminal Avenue and walk.

For Hairpin Chalets and Grandstands 19, 21, 22, 23 & 25, use Stadium Plaza entrance (Terry Fox Plaza): Ride SkyTrain to Stadium Station and walk two blocks south along Beatty Street or take a regular #3, #4, #7, #8, #10, #14, #16, #20 or #50 and walk about seven blocks along Robson Street from Granville Mall. For Grandstand 26, use the entrance at Beatty & Dunsmuir. Ride SkyTrain to Stadium Station, walk south on Beatty across Dunsmuir, or from Terry Fox Plaza walk two blocks north on Beatty.

Additional transit service, Sunday, August 31

SkyTrain will be operating one hour earlier. The first train will leave King George Station at 6:08 am and arrive at Stadium Station at approximately 6:43. Additional **bus service** will be provided on selected major routes to accommodate passengers wishing to connect with earlier SkyTrain service.

SeaBus will leave Lonsdale Quay every 30 minutes from 7:02 to 11:02 am; then every 15 minutes to 6:02 pm. Service from Vancouver will be every 15 minutes from 11:16 am to 6:46 pm.

Minor reroutes. Because of the closure of the Cambie Street Bridge to northbound traffic, August 29, 30 & 31, the #15 and #17 to downtown will be rerouted at Broadway via the Granville Bridge to Robson, and will then continue on their regular routes. Please note that they will operate "Express" from Broadway to Granville & Robson with stops only at major transfer points.
