

44 Downtown/UBC

Service on this popular route will continue throughout the summer months. Frequency will be reduced slightly in the morning, but will be unchanged in the afternoon.

49 Metrotown Station/Dunbar Loop/UBC

During the spring and summer months, all peak period trips will terminate at Dunbar Loop, where customers can transfer to a #41. Service will be reinstated to UBC for the start of fall classes.

52 Around the Park




