

Some schedule extensions for Canada Day, July 1

If you are planning to head downtown on Canada Day, perhaps you should also plan to leave the car at home and use transit.

While SkyTrain will commence service at regular Sunday and holiday times: 7:08 am from King George Station and 7:50 am from Waterfront Station, extra trains will operate during the day and evening to serve passengers wishing to enjoy the full day of Canada Place events, beginning at 10:30 am, in celebration of our nation's 131st birthday. Don't miss the fireworks finale beginning at 10:30 pm. Those exiting through Howe Street will have an opportunity to pre-pay their return fare at a special farebox within the station. Immediately after the fireworks, concentrated service (every 2-3 minutes) will operate to get everyone home as soon as possible. Naturally, passengers with prepaid fares will be able to board faster.

SkyTrain service will be extended to operate until regular weekday times: last train from Waterfront at 1:15 am.

SeaBus service will also be extended to 12:16 am.

Timetable revisions

Surrey, North Delta and White Rock/ Langley booklet, effective June 29

351 Vancouver/Crescent Beach - terminus

The terminus has changed from Beecher at Sullivan to Sullivan at Kidd. The *351 Vancouver* will travel via Sullivan to McBride, Beecher and the regular route.

356 Cranley/White Rock Centre - rerouted

The 356 Cranley from White Rock Centre will be rerouted via North Bluff, 156th St, and 20th Ave, then continue along the regular route. Returning, the 356 White Rock Centre will follow the regular route to 156th St, then travel via 16th Ave, 152nd St and Martin to North Bluff (White Rock Centre).

358 Seaside - terminus

The terminus has been changed from Semiahmoo Mall to White Rock Centre - Bay 2 (on North Bluff at Johnston). The 358 Seaside will travel from White Rock Centre via North Bluff, Johnston, Buena Vista, Oxford, Marine, Maple, Columbia, Centre, Pacific, Johnston, Thrift and Foster to North Bluff (White Rock Centre).

June 28 and July 5 **SkyTrain track maintenance**

SkyTrain service to and from Surrey will be affected by maintenance work near Scott Road Station, all day and evening on two consecutive Sundays, June 28 and July 5. Trains between Vancouver (Waterfront) and Surrey (King George) will operate about every 10 minutes instead of the usual 4-5. Additional trains will operate between Waterfront and Columbia Stations to provide near-normal service within Vancouver, Burnaby and New Westminster.

Surrey-bound passengers on these "short-turn" trains will be advised to change trains at New Westminster Station, Please listen for announcements and follow the directions of our staff. We will do our best to minimize inconvenience. Thanks in advance for your cooperation and patience.

Please stand behind the red line

A clearly visible red line has been installed on the aisle floor and ceiling of all buses, just behind the driver. The line is there for your safety and the safety of everyone on board. With no passengers standing forward of the red line, the driver has a clear view of the rear-view mirror and what's happening on the right side of the bus... cyclists, pedestrians stepping off the sidewalk, motorists pulling out of side streets or opening their doors, etc. He/she needs this unrestricted view to operate the bus safely. If other passengers board after you, please move down the bus as far as possible so that they too can stand behind the red line. Thanks for your cooperation.
