
50th Anniversary · Take a trip down memory lane



Years of trolley bus service in Vancouver



The August 13th, 1948 Buzzer carried the headline: "HERE THEY COME.

Trolley coaches to make their appearance on streets August 16."

The Buzzer's map of the first route shows how trolley coaches would travel from Main Street via Pender, Seymour and Robson to the Cambie Street terminus at 29th Avenue. Today, fourteen trolley routes carry 59.2 million passengers a year in the Vancouver Regional Transit System. (See pages 6 & 7)

Please be aware that for the safety and convenience of everyone on board,

food and drinks may not be consumed on BC Transit vehicles

and that ONLY FOOD THAT IS PROPERLY WRAPPED AND BEVERAGES THAT ARE SECURELY COVERED may be transported. Bus operators, SkyTrain and SeaBus staff appreciate your cooperation.

Where would you like to see additional bus shelters?

There are approximately 1260 bus shelters throughout the Vancouver region. Most have been installed by advertising companies, in cooperation with local municipalities.

We would like to know where you would like to have additional shelters in the region, so that we can compile a list of priority locations for the future. In selecting preferred locations, there are a few conditions you should keep in mind.

- Does the bus serve a major activity centre, such as a shopping mall?
- Is the stop located at a transit loop, exchange, or major transfer point?
- Is there enough room on the sidewalk to accommodate a shelter?
- Is the sidewalk paved?

We would very much appreciate your input on potential new locations.

The better way to get to the PNE, August 22 - September 7

From Downtown

On Granville Mall, board a #123 New Westminster Stn or a #135 SFU (both accessible) or a #4 Powell, a #10 Hastings or #16 29th Ave Station bus for direct service to the PNE.

From West Vancouver

Take a "Blue Bus" to downtown Vancouver and transfer on Georgia to an eastbound #123 or #135 or at Granville to a northbound #4, #10 or #16 for direct service to the PNE.

From North Vancouver

#28 and #210 buses provide regular service to the PNE from Phibbs Exchange. The #28 stops on Cassiar at Hastings. The #210 stops on McGill at Renfrew. For service across Lions Gate Bridge (#240, 246, 247) transfer on Georgia at Denman to an eastbound #123 or #135 or at Granville to a northbound #4, #10 or #16 for direct service to the PNE.

From Coquitlam

#151 and #152 buses provide direct service to the PNE from Coquitlam Recreation Centre and Lougheed Mall. Both routes stop at Hastings & Cassiar and Hastings & Renfrew.

From Port Moody/Coquitlam Centre/ Port Coquitlam

#160 buses connect Port Moody, Coquitlam Centre and Port Coquitlam with the PNE. The buses stop at Hastings & Cassiar and Hastings & Renfrew.

From Richmond

Take a Vancouver-bound bus to Broadway & Granville and transfer to a Special Broadway-PNE bus.

From North Burnaby

Board a #123 Stanley Park or #135 Stanley Park bus for direct service to Hastings & Cassiar, Windermere or Renfrew. Or take a local bus to Kootenay Loop and transfer to a #10 UBC.

From South Burnaby/New Westminster

Take a local bus to any SkyTrain station. Ride SkyTrain to 29th Avenue Station and transfer to a special PNE Express (Bay #1). Or board a #123 on Canada Way or Willingdon.

From Surrey/North Delta

Take a local bus to any SkyTrain station. Ride SkyTrain to 29th Avenue Station and transfer to a PNE Express (Bay #1).


From South Delta/Ladner

Take a #640 to Scott Road Station (wheelchair passengers transfer to #330 Surrey Central Station). Ride SkyTrain to 29th Avenue Station and transfer to special PNE Express bus (Bay #1). Or take a #601 bus to Broadway & Granville and transfer to a special Broadway-PNE bus.

From White Rock/South Surrey

Take a #321, #390 or #394 bus to SkyTrain, ride SkyTrain to 29th Avenue Station and transfer to a special PNE Express bus (Bay #1). Or take a #351 bus to Broadway & Granville and transfer to a special Broadway-PNE bus.

Three express routes to the PNE



29th Avenue Station - PNE

From 29th Avenue Station (Bay #1) and return every 15 minutes, from approximately 10 am to midnight. Northbound buses will provide express service, stopping only at transfer points. Southbound buses will operate from the Coliseum Loop as #16 29th Avenue Station, stopping at all regular stops.

Phibbs Exchange - PNE

Service every 30 minutes from 10 am to midnight.

Broadway - PNE

From Broadway & Fir to the Coliseum Loop and return every 15 minutes from 9 am to midnight.
