you can be the winner by taking transit to the track. SeaBus and buses throughout the Lower Mainland connect with SkyTrain and SkyTrain will take you to Science World-Main Street Station or Stadium Station, both close to the track.

Other buses will drop you off within easy walking distance. Check your race tickets in advance to identify your most convenient route and entrance gate.

For Pit Row Suites, Turn #1 Boxes, Gold Chalets, Champ Club and Gold Grandstands #1 and #2, use the Plaza of Nations Entrance, south of BC Place: Ride SkyTrain to Stadium Station and exit via Pacific Blvd, walk one block west on EXPO Blvd, one block south on Griffiths Way, then west on Pacific Blvd to the Plaza of Nations. Or take a regular #3, #4, #5, #6, #7, #8, #10, #16, #20 or #50 bus and walk seven blocks along Robson Street from Granville Mall. Or take a #15 or #17 bus to the first stop at the north end of the Cambie Street Bridge and walk to the Plaza of Nations.

For Silver Chalets, Flag Club, Silver Grandstands #1, #2, #3, #4 and Bronze Grandstand #1, use the two entrances off 1st Ave at Ontario, and between Columbia and Manitoba: Ride SkyTrain to Main Street-Science World Station and walk south on Quebec to 1st Ave, then west to Ontario. Or take the #3, #8 or #19 bus along Main Street to 1st Ave.

Additional transit service, Sunday, Sept. 6.

SkyTrain will be operating an hour earlier. The first train will leave King George Station at 6:08 am and arrive at Stadium Station at approximately 6:43.

Additional bus service will be provided on selected major routes to accommodate passengers wishing to connect with SkyTrain service.

SeaBus will leave Lonsdale Quay every 30 minutes from 7:02 to 11:02 am; then every 15 minutes to 6:32 pm. Service from Vancouver will leave every 15 minutes from 11:16 am to 6:46 pm.

Vancouver

3 Main/Downtown

Additional frequency northbound on Main Street during the AM peak period.

2 Macdonald-16th Ave/Yaletown

15 Cambie/Downtown

17 Oak/Downtown

22 Knight/Macdonald

Service will be increased during the AM and PM peak periods.

25 Brentwood/UBC

Service immediately before and after the PM peak period will be increased.

28 Capilano College/Phibbs Exchange/ Kootenay Loop/Joyce

During the AM and PM peak periods, the #28 will operate in both directions between Phibbs Exchange and Capilano College.

44 Downtown/UBC

Service will be improved, with more frequent PM peak service and articulated buses on the busiest AM peak trips. The PM peak period will be extended, with the last trip leaving UBC at 6:10 pm.

49 UBC/Dunbar Loop/Metrotown

More frequent mid-day service, Monday to Saturday.

Burnaby

99 B-Line into Lougheed Mall Exchange

The B-Line will now terminate inside Lougheed Mall Bus Loop at Bay 5. (See separate B-Line information on this spread).

104 Annacis Island/22nd Street

Peak period service will be introduced to the Port Royal area in Queensborough.

109 Brentwood Mall/Boundary Loop

Discontinued. The new 7-day-a-week evening and Sunday daytime service provided by 99 B-Line will replace the #109 service.

116 Metrotown Station/Suncrest

Extra peak period trips will operate into Glenlyon Business Park with a bus approx. every 15 minutes.

130 Metrotown Station/Kootenay Loop

More frequent AM peak period service will be provided between Metrotown and Brentwood Exchange.

131 Edmonds Station/Kootenay Loop

Buses will operate directly to Kootenay Loop via Gilmore and Hastings, and return by the same route.

133 SFU/Metrotown Station

Peak period trips (every 30 minutes) will leave Metrotown Station at approx 10 and 40 minutes past the hour. Leave SFU at approx 26 and 56 minutes past the hour.

135 SFU/Stanley Park

This service will now use articulated buses. Minor adjustments will be made to service between SFU and Kootenay Loop.

NEW ROUTE

139 Burnaby Heights/Kootenay Loop

The new #139 will operate every 30 minutes during the day between Kootenay Loop and Burnaby Heights (via Eton) to a loop around the Safeway store at Hastings & Willingdon, replacing the #131.

Northeast Sector

147 New Westminster Stn/Coquitlam Stn

148 New Westminster Station/Ioco

156 Lougheed Mall/Coquitlam Station

More frequent service between Lougheed Mall and New Westminster Station. The three services will combine to provide a bus every 10 minutes, daytime until 7:00 pm, Monday to Saturday. Note also that during this time the services will not operate into Lougheed Mall Exchange. Customers should board on North Road instead.

After 7:00 pm and on Sundays and holidays, the three services will continue to operate into Lougheed Mall Exchange to make timed-transfer connections with other buses.

162 Port Coquitlam Centre/ Coast Meridian/River Springs

164 Coquitlam Station/Coast Meridian/ River Springs

These routes will now provide direct service to the Hyde Creek recreation facility on Laurier.

New Westminster Station Bus Loop

To accommodate more frequent #147, 148 and 156 service at New Westminster Station, these routes will now depart from Bay 2 on Columbia Street. Routes #102, 108 and limited 321 service will now depart from Bay 5.



North Vancouver

28 Capilano College/Phibbs Exchange/ Kootenay Loop/Joyce

During the AM and PM peaks, the #28 route will be extended to operate in both directions between Phibbs Exchange and Capilano College.

214 Blueridge/Phibbs Exchange/Vancouver

The trip leaving Sechelt & Hyannis at 8:30 am will continue on from Phibbs Exchange to downtown Vancouver, arriving at 9:12 am.

236 Lonsdale Quay/Grouse Mountain

Mid-day and PM peak period trips will now operate every 30 minutes, year round, between Lonsdale Quay and Grouse Mountain.

239 Capilano College

With the extension of the #28 to the College, some peak period "overload" trips will be discontinued.

240 15th Street/Vancouver

To serve passengers with early work starts downtown, an extra trip will leave 15th Street at Grand Boulevard at 5:30 am, Monday to Friday.

241 Vancouver/Upper Lonsdale

Service will be increased between 5:30 and 6:30 pm, Monday to Friday.

246 Lonsdale Quay/Highland/Vancouver

An extra trip will leave downtown Vancouver at 6:34 pm, Monday to Friday.

285 SFU/Capilano College/Phibbs Exchange

With the extension of the #28 route to Capilano College and the introduction of articulated buses on the #135 route, the #285 will be discontinued.

Surrey

319 Scottsdale/Scott Road Station

Peak period service will be improved to operate every 10 minutes.

320 Guildford/Surrey Central Station

In the AM and PM peak periods, an extra trip will operate to and from Surrey Central Station.

324 Newton Exch/Surrey Central Station

Sunday and holiday service will be improved.

332 Guildford/Surrey Central Station

In the AM peak period, an extra trip will operate to Surrey Central Station.

340 Scottsdale Mall/22nd Street Station/ Newton Exchange

In the AM peak, an extra trip will operate from the Surrey Civic Centre.

351 Crescent Beach/Vancouver

In the AM peak period, an extra early trip will get you downtown before 6:00 am. The new Crescent Beach terminus is on Sullivan Street at Kidd Road.

352 White Rock/Vancouver

Service will be increased during the fall/winter months.

354 White Rock South/Vancouver

In the AM peak period, an extra early trip will get you downtown before 6:00 am.

358 Seaside

Your uptown to downtown White Rock connector will continue throughout the fall and winter.

Richmond

403 Three Road/Vancouver

An extra morning trip will operate from Richmond Exchange to Vancouver, Monday to Friday.

Ladner

601 Ladner Exchange/Vancouver

608 Ladner Ring Road

During the AM peak period, service from Ladner Exchange to Vancouver will be increased to assist passengers who begin work at 8:00 am.

Cyclists will be able to head for any B-Line stop, load their bikes, have a fast, comfortable ride to another stop and cycle to their final destination. Thanks to the Alma Mater Society of UBC for funding 50% of the cost of these bike racks.

A few regular-size buses without bike racks may also be used to provide extra service when demand is high.
