
## New weekend and holiday Lost Lagoon service, May 16 to September 13 56 Lost Lagoon Loop

On a trial basis BC Transit will provide service around Lost Lagoon on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays to improve access to the Park for customers in the West End and other locations.

From 9:00 am to 6:00 pm. May 16 to June 28 and on September 13, a bus will leave Stanley Park Loop every 30 minutes and travel via Chilco, Georgia, Denman, Davie, Beach, Stanley Park Drive, North Lagoon Drive, Causeway, Georgia Street, Chilco and back to Stanley Park Loop.

From July 1 to September 7 the service will be extended to terminate at Upper Zoo Loop. From the terminus buses will travel via Pipeline Road, under Causeway, Causeway. Georgia, Chilco, Stanley Park Loop, Chilco, Georgia,

# SkyTrain and #640 bus service to Tsawwassen Ferry Terminal

Please remember that the #640 operates to and from only one SkyTrain station: Scott Road, and the elevator at Scott Road is on the east side of the station and isn't accessible to conventional buses.

Wheelchair passengers wishing to board the #640 should therefore detrain at Surrey Central Station, take the #330 to Scott Road Station and transfer to the #640. #640 passengers wishing to board SkyTrain can transfer to the #330 at Scott Road and board SkyTrain at Surrey Central Station.

Alternatively, passengers may phone Surrey handyDART at 591-8234 before starting their trip and request shuttle service between the west and east sides of Scott Road Station. Surrey handyDART office hours are 8 am to noon and 1 to 4 pm, Monday to Friday; 9 am to 5 pm, Saturday, Sunday and holidays.
