

Summer capacity reduction. On weekdays, trip times will be adjusted during morning peak hours.

42 Spanish Banks/Chancellor

On Sundays and holidays until Labour Day, buses will leave UBC Botanical Gardens hourly from 8:33 am until the last trip at 6:33 pm. From Spanish Banks service will run hourly from 9:00 am to 6:00 pm. An evening trip leaving Spanish Banks at 7:00 pm will operate to Alma

North Vancouver

From June 15 to Labour Day, Sunday and holiday sailings will operate every 15 minutes between the following times: from Lonsdale Quay 11:02 am to 6:32 pm and from Waterfront Station 11:16 am to 6:46 pm.

SERVICE INCREASE

229 Lonsdale Quay/Westlynn/Phibbs Exch (L) 230 Lonsdale & 23rd/Lonsdale Quay (L)

SUMMER SERVICE INCREASE

All West Vancouver buses are now bike-rack equipped.

Burnaby/New Westminster

SUMMER SERVICE INCREASE

23 New Westminster Station/Stanley Park (L)

The route will be extended to include the Upper Zoo.

28 Joyce Station/Phibbs Exchange/ Capilano College (L)

Until Labour Day, buses will terminate at Phibbs Exchange, where Capilano College customers can transfer to the 239 Capilano College

35 SFU/Stanley Park (L)

During evenings and holidays, routes 23 and 35 will combine to provide customers with increased service to Stanley Park and the Upper Zoo area. During the daytime, the combined frequency will provide a bus every 7-8 minutes; in the evening every 15 minutes.

SERVICE INCREASE

49 Metrotown Station/Dunbar Loop/UBC (L)

Sunday and holiday service will increase from every 20 minutes to every 15 minutes.

SERVICE INCREASE

99 B-Line (L)

East of Brentwood Mall, to Lougheed Mall, midday service will be increased to every 15 minutes.

Midday Monday to Friday, and evening Sunday and holiday trips that presently terminate at Brentwood Mall, will be extended to Lougheed Mall.

123 New Westminster Station/Stanley Park (L)

Until Labour Day, the route will be extended to Stanley Park and the Upper Zoo area.

SERVICE AREA INCREASED

135 SFU/Stanley Park (L)

Until Labour Day, the route will be extended from the Stanley Park Loop to include the Upper Zoo area.

Surrey, Langley & White Rock

SUNDAY/HOLIDAY EARLIER SERVICE

320 Surrey Central Station/Langley Centre (L)

Sunday and holiday service now begins earlier in Langley. New trips, serving Langley, Cloverdale and Fleetwood, leave Langley Centre for Surrey Central Station at 6:02 and 7:02 am

SERVICE INCREASE

321 White Rock South/White Rock Centre/ Surrey Central Station (L)

Service between White Rock Centre and Surrey City Centre (SkyTrain) will be increased all evenings, and on weekend mornings.

Evenings: Trips will now operate every 30 minutes, northbound and southbound.

(L) Accessible (B) Bike-rack equipped

Saturdays, Sundays and holidays: Northbound service will begin earlier with trips leaving White Rock Centre before 6:00 am. Northbound half-hourly service will also begin earlier, at 8:22 am.

SERVICE INCREASE

351 Crescent Beach/Vancouver (B) (L)

On Sunday and holidays, morning AM service to Vancouver and evening PM service from Vancouver will improve from every 60 minutes to every 30 minutes. New trips leave Sullivan & Kidd in Crescent Beach at 10:00 and 11:00 am. And three afternoon trips will be added, leaving Burrard Station for White Rock at 3:33, 4:33 and 5:33 pm.

SUMMER CAPACITY REDUCTION

352 White Rock/Vancouver

Until Labour Day, the trip leaving 148th and 24th Ave in White Rock at 6:40 am will not operate and trip times will be adjusted.

BUS STOP CHANGES

511 Aldergrove/Langley Centre (L)

Due to safety concerns, the #511 will be rerouted to operate in both directions via 221A Street, discontinuing service on the hospital access road. Two stops will be introduced on 221A Street (just east of the main

SUMMER CAPACITY REDUCTION

151 Coquitlam Station/Vancouver (L)

The weekday trip leaving Lougheed Mall at 6:57 am for downtown Vancouver will be discontinued until Labour Day.

SERVICE INCREASE

159 New Westminster Station/ **Port Coquitlam Centre**

Three AM trips from New Westminster Station, Monday to Friday, will be added at 5:47, 6:17 and 8:20. The trip currently leaving at 8:02 am will now leave at 7:56 am. Three PM trips from Port Coquitlam Centre will be added at 2:55, 6:03 and 6:25. One PM trip will be eliminated and times will be adjusted accordingly.

SERVICE CAPACITY REDUCTION

160 Port Coquitlam Station/ Coquitlam Station/Vancouver (L)

Until Labour Day, all the times of AM trips leaving Coquitlam Station for downtown Vancouver, between 5:53 and 6:56, will be adjusted slightly.

Update: SkyTrain track construction

As regular SkyTrain passengers crossing the bridge will have noticed, work on the new track turnout east of Columbia Station has been progressing well. The track switch has been installed, and the second pour of concrete has been set. Running rail, LIM rail and power rail will soon be re-installed and it is expected that the track will be reopened in the latter part of June, somewhat

Please watch for updated infomation at SkyTrain stations and in the meantime, continue to watch the destination signs and listen for announcements.

Summer SkyTrain service

Once the track construction is completed, later this month, SkyTrain will resume full service, with augmented mid-day service to accommodate heavy summer ridership. Service during early weekday afternoons (before rush hour) and on weekend afternoons, will operate every four minutes.

As always, additional service will be provided for major events, including Canada Day, Symphony of Fire and the Vancouver Indy.
