Transit is Public Education by Arthur Orsini, Vancouver

There are many things we cannot teach our children. They need to be around and learn from strangers. It's like a "It takes a village to raise a child" kind-of-thing. And so I am glad we rely on the bus. It's very educational.

Transit is relatively cheap and my kids love it because they get to meet and talk with a variety of people. Okay, well not the very rich but pretty much everyone else. I can't think of any other public space where they have such liberty with strangers and I have no anxiety about it. They talk to anyone; seniors, radicals, sleepy heads, lovers, business people and teenagers.

We've met university students who went through great pains to explain their course of study in simple English. Men have made funny faces to get them laughing out loud. The kids have touched pink hair - something they've never had the opportunity to do at home. They've barked and meowed in chorus with a bus driver for 15 blocks on the 99 Express. And then to great delight, the bus home greeted us with a meow and a few seconds of confusion until my daughter

screamed, "It's the same driver!"

My son claimed to have learned to read at 3: whenever the bell rang he'd point to the front of the bus, slide his finger from left to right and proudly 'read' NEXT STOP! My daughter, despite our bidding, prefers to stand and is the first to get up and offer her seat to anyone older than herself. They know that the #15 becomes a #17 when it gets downtown. They know that the #100 goes to the airport and they beg us to take a trip so we can board that bus.

I have learned too. I used to hush their questions to strangers until it became clear how un-offensive it was and how much they got out of it. But I hadn't even noticed what transit was doing to my children until an elderly lady, getting out at our stop, grabbed hold of my elbow. She told me how charmed and impressed she was with my then 3-year-old daughter's conversation skills. Without thinking, I replied. "It's 'cause we don't have a car. We take the bus a lot." It takes a bus load to raise a child.

New wheelchair accessible and bike rack services to commence November 15

As noted in a previous issue of The Buzzer, some new buses and bike racks didn't arrive in time to provide the new wheelchair and bike rack services listed in the fall timetables. Well, they're here now and ready to go into service on November 15.



The following routes will introduce wheel chair accessible service as listed in the September 6 timetables:

- 44 Downtown/UBC 143 Coquitlam Stn/SFU
- 158/159 Port Coquitlam Centre/New Westminster Stn • 169 Coquitlam Stn/New Westminster Stn
- 312/319 Scott Road Stn/Scottsdale.

The following routes will introduce bike rack service as listed in the September 6 timetables:

•100 New Westminster Stn/22nd St Stn/Marpole/Airport • 135 SFU/ Stanley Park • 145 Lougheed Mall/

SFU • 147 Coquitlam Stn/New Westminster Stn • 158/159 Port Coquitlam Centre/New Westminster

Stn • 160 Port Coquitlam Stn/Coquitlam Stn/ Vancouver • 701 Maple Ridge East/South Haney/ Haney Place/Coquitlam Stn.

In addition, the 99 B-Line, 351 Crescent Beach/ Vancouver and 601 South Delta/Vancouver routes. which now provide bike rack service with the exception of a few individual trips, will provide bike rack service on all trips specified in the September 6 timetables.

New Westminster buses detoured as work commences on Tunnel extension



SkyTrain extension from Columbia Station to Lougheed Mall began on October 13. As a result, the off-ramp from the Pattullo Bridge to northbound Columbia Street is now closed and the northbound McBride to eastbound Royal left-turn is banned for all vehicles, including buses.

The off-ramp is being temporarily re-aligned to serve as a through route for Columbia Street traffic, including bus routes #102, 147, 148, 156, 158, 159 and 169 which will remain on the re-aligned Columbia Street. The construction also requires temporary changes to local transit services, including detours for the following routes:

- #106 New Westminster Station/Metrotown Station
- #108 Eighth Avenue
- #145 Scott Road Station/Lougheed Mall/SFU

The first of these detours, for the #108 Eighth Avenue route, was introduced on October 13. From New Westminster Station the bus is routed via Carnaryon. Elliott, Agnes, 1st Street to Royal and the regular route. We realize this detour may not be convenient for some

seniors, who make up a sizable portion of the ridership. However, the Carnarvon routing is required to accommodate vehicle limitations and to make a consistent detour routing possible for the duration of the construction project, probably until September 2000.

Temporary bus stops have been introduced on the new portion of the #108 route and all-weather boards posted at existing Columbia Street bus stops to advise customers of the change. Neither the routing at New Westminster Station nor the schedule is affected.

The #106 and #145 routes will be detoured when construction closes Elliott Street and other roadways in the vicinity. Other bus stops will also be temporarily discontinued or relocated.

SkyTrain escalator maintenance at Granville Station

On October 19 one of the three long escalators at Granville Station was taken out of service for up to four weeks. A major overhaul is required after nearly 14 years of operation.
