BUS LOOP CLOSING

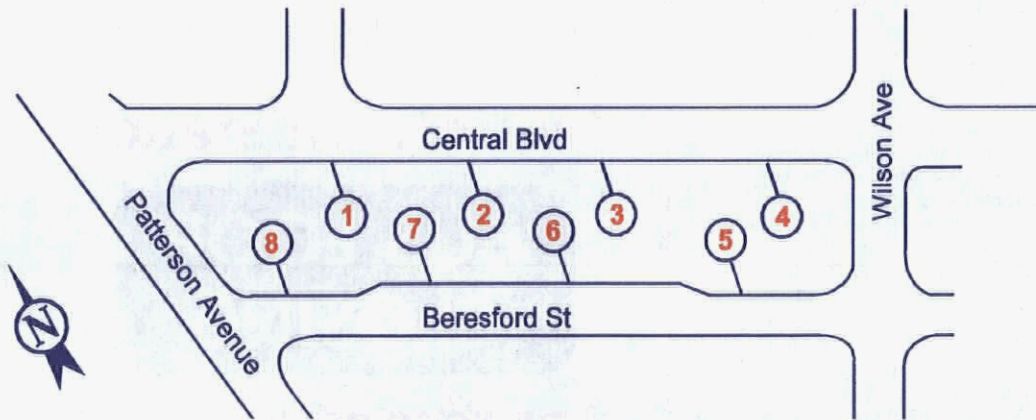
for reconstruction, effective Monday, September 17

The bus loop will be closed for extensive reconstruction for approximately two months. All buses that normally terminate there will be rerouted to a temporary terminus/transfer point at Patterson SkyTrain Station.

Heading for Metrotown?

You can still take SkyTrain, of course, and the #110, #114, #115, #116 and #144 routes will stop at Metrotown, under the pedestrian walkway, on the way to and from the temporary terminus at Patterson Station.

#19, #49, #106, #112, #129 and #133 bus passengers arriving at Patterson Station can transfer to SkyTrain or to a #110, #114, #115, #116 or #144 bus to get to Metrotown and return.

Post-secondary students

With a Fast Trax Transit Strip attached to their student I.D.'s, post secondary students can travel throughout the system anytime on a regularly-priced adult one-zone monthly FareCard. The strip is available at student union offices at eligible post secondary institutions. Both I.D. and FareCard must be shown when boarding and when requested.
