

## GoCards for Grades 8 to 12 2001/2002 GoCards must be shown from November 1

Beginning November 1, all high school students must show 2001/2002 GoCards when paying Concession fares on TransLink. Those without new GoCards must pay the adult fare.

Students who missed the school photo session or have lost their GoCards can obtain one immediately by going to: The Artona Group Inc, 353 West 7th Ave, Vancouver. GoCard photography sessions will also be provided by Apple Photographic Services, October 13 to November 27 in a mobile unit that will travel to locations throughout Greater Vancouver.

Students going to The Artona Group, Mountain West Studios or Apple Photographic Services must have a GoCard application form (available at school offices) signed by a school official, proof of age (birth certificate, passport or CareCard) and an \$8 fee. A GoCard will be issued immediately.

## Service change, effective October 15 #28 Joyce Station/Phibbs Exchange/ Capilano College

With the installation of traffic signals at the intersection of Boundary Road and Burke Street, #28 southbound service from Boundary Road will be rerouted to Smith Avenue, between Moscrop Street and Burke Street. The change will re-introduce two-way service along this portion of the route.

Customers along Smith Ave will benefit by having a shorter walk to the southbound service and by not having to cross Boundary Road.

## Courtesies that can make travel safer and more comfortable for you and other transit riders.

- ✓ Allowing people to disembark before attempting to board.
- ✓ Moving well away from the doors so that others may board. In a bus, moving behind the red line and as far to the rear as possible.
- ✓ Not occupying two seats by putting clothing or other belongings beside us, or sitting in the aisle seat when the window seat is empty.
- ✓ Disembarking by the rear doors when possible.
- ✓ Removing a backpack before boarding so that it won't be accidentally pushed into someone's face.
- ✓ Being careful that shoulder bags, umbrellas and cameras don't swing and hit a seated passenger on the head.
- ✓ Binding skis and poles so that there are no sharp points and carrying them in an upright position.

- ✓ Controlling the volume of music players so that others aren't disturbed.
- ✓ Not eating or drinking on board. Regulations say that only food that is properly wrapped and beverages that are securely covered may be transported.
- ✓ Cheerfully giving up "Courtesy" seats to the elderly and people with disabilities. The first forward-facing seats are particularly appropriate for blind and visually impaired passengers accompanied by dog guides.
- ✓ Keeping to the right on escalators to allow those in a hurry to pass.

## It happened in October

**Oct 16, 1940.** The RCMP ship St. Roch arrived in Vancouver from Halifax via the Northwest Passage. It was the first ship to have sailed through the Passage in both directions.

**Oct 17, 1918.** The first issue of Ubyssy, the student newspaper at UBC, was published.

**Oct 18, 1928.** Vancouver's first traffic light, at Main & Hastings, went into service.
