220-stall Park & Ride Opening soon

A new 220 stall paid parking facility, managed by Advanced Parking Systems for Bentall Real Estate Services, will open in late July beneath the future bus loop at the **Millennium Line Production Way - University SkyTrain station**. It will offer a convenient park-ride option for transit patrons in the northeast Burnaby and west Coquitlam areas. Half of the space will be secured monthly parking, at \$70 (plus taxes) per month, through Advanced Parking Systems, 604-688-4575, www.advancedparking.com. A 15% discount up to December 31, 2003 is being offered to the first 50 people who sign up.

Assistance Dogs on Transit

Ever get on a bus, see a puppy in a cape and wonder what it's doing there? There's a good chance it's a dog in training...learning how to assist a future recipient in getting around the city.

Everyone is familiar with guide dogs, but many aren't aware of Service Dogs...specifically trained to help people with a variety of needs, including those in wheelchairs, those who are hard of hearing or deaf, or who have mobility or agility impairments.

Pacific Assistance Dogs Society (PADS) raises and trains service dogs and hearing dogs in Burnaby. They become amazing helpers who can be seen all over the Lower Mainland in their blue backpacks or vests as they help provide someone with a greater level of independence. You will recognize a PADS puppy in training by its yellow and blue cape...he may be sitting on the floor beside you as you ride transit. SkyTrain Customer Update

Work continues on Platform Edge Upgrading Project

From now until the end of July, platform edge work crews are working at Columbia Station and once that is completed they will move onwards to Scott Road and then Gateway Station. Work will take place in the evenings after 9 pm on the following dates:

Columbia Stn: Sun, July 13 -Thurs, July 17

Millennium Line Trains to/from Commercial Drive will operate approximately every 12 minutes and terminate at Columbia Station. Continuing passengers must change to/from the Expo Line at Columbia. **Supplementary service** will be added, with additional trains operating between Commercial Drive and Sapperton stations to reduce waiting times for passengers over most of the line.

Expo Line Trains to/from King George will operate approximately every 10-15 minutes, with a short delay at either 22nd Street, New Westminster or Scott Road Station. **Supplementary service** will be added, with additional trains operating between Waterfront and New Westminster Stations to reduce waiting times for passengers over much of the line.

Scott Road and Gateway Stations: Sundays - Thursdays, July 20-31

Please note: work will not be conducted on Thurs, July 24 (B.C. Lions Home Game) and Wed, July 30 (Fireworks at English Bay).

Millennium Line Trains will operate as normal, Commercial Drive to/from Waterfront every 8 minutes.

Expo Line Trains to/from King George will operate every 8 minutes approx. with a possible short delay at either Surrey Central or Scott Road Station.

We thank you for your patience during these essential project upgrades. Every effort will be made to minimize delays and inconvenience for passengers.
