New trolley bus pairings offer faster, more accessible service for

a greater number of people Because of Vancouver's unique geography, many trolley bus routes start in one part of the city and

continue through downtown to provide service in another part of the city. Besides offering more efficient service, connecting corridors allow easier access to more destinations and pairings are based on demand for service.

Increased demand in certain areas has prompted the expansion of B-Line services and has contributed to a review of trolley pairings, particularly those travelling along Granville Street. Input from the City of Vancouver and the public has helped determine combinations that would best represent customer service needs with minimal impact on operational costs.

Bikes on SkyTrain

For the safety and comfort of all passengers, we ask cyclists to remember the following policies and rules. Bicycles on SkyTrain are limited to the following hours:

• Monday to Friday, 9:30 am to 3 pm, and 6:30 pm until the end of service.

• **Saturdays, Sundays and statutory holidays, all day.** The above times may be further limited without notice under direction of TransLink staff, subject to operational difficulty or excessive loading conditions.

• A maximum of two bicycles will be permitted on each train in the designated boarding location - the last door of the last car.

Bikes are to remain in the doorway and may not be moved into the aisles of the train. Cyclists will be responsible for holding on to their bikes at all times while on the trains and in stations. Please be careful and considerate of other passengers.

• Bicycles are not permitted on escalators.


All access to and from platforms is restricted to elevators and stairways only.

• Cyclists must give priority to passengers in wheelchairs, scooters and passengers with service animals wishing to board SkyTrain.

• Cyclists are required to follow directions from SkyTrain Attendants and TransLink Special Provincial Constables.

• Cyclists under 13 years must be accompanied by an adult.

• Bicycles may not be ridden anywhere inside stations or trains.



• Bicycles may not enter or exit at Granville or Metrotown stations at any time due to limited

access and frequent congestion. (Please use adjacent stations (Burrard or Stadium, or Patterson or Royal Oak) Your cooperation will help ensure that this pilot program is successful.

In addition to SkyTrain, bicycles are also permitted on the following TransLink vehicles:

Buses (bike-rack-equipped), SeaBus, and West Coast Express.

SkyTrain Rider Alert Main Street/ Science World Station Platform Edge Upgrade

September 6th & 7th

As part of the system wide update of the 20 Expo Line stations, SkyTrain will be upgrading the Main Street Station platform with yellow tactile edging to better serve the needs of our visually impaired passengers. Construction activities will take place during the day, with regular service expected to resume in the early evening, both Saturday and Sunday.

In the unlikely event that work can not be completed within these times, the project will continue the following weekend Saturday, September 13th and/or Sunday, September 14th.

Expo Line trains will serve all stations between King George and Waterfront, but will operate less frequently (every 6-10 minutes). and will usually be held for up to 6 minutes at either Stadium or Nanaimo station. We suggest you allow an extra 10 to 15 minutes for your trip, although every effort will be made to minimize delays and inconvenience. At Main Street and Broadway stations trains will operate in both directions from one side of the platform. Please watch the platform destination signs, listen to announcements and follow directions provided by our staff.

We thank you for your patience during these essential project upgrades. Every effort will be made to minimize delays and inconvenience to our passengers.

Connections at Columbia for Millennium Line passengers

Please note that during this time, Millennium Line trains from Commercial Drive will terminate at Columbia Station. Passengers continuing west must change to a "Waterfront" train at Columbia. Eastbound Millennium Line passengers from Vancouver and Burnaby must board an Expo Line "King George" train and change at either Broadway or Columbia.

The Lucky Bus from Scratch & Win shows up randomly on bus routes all ov er the Lower Mainland. If the Lucky Bus shows up at your stop, consider yourself, well, lucky. Every now and then, a Scratch & Win :"Cruise Director" will be on board to give away free rides, Scratch & Win tickets, coupons, samples, and more.

Regular train washing reduced

In response to reduced water reservoir levels within the GVRD, SkyTrain and West Coast Express have suspended regular train washing until the current shortage has eased. Ordinarily, SkyTrain cars are given an outside wash two or three times a week to remove deposits which build up after many kilometres of operation. With the reduction, train exteriors will not look as clean as

usual for the next couple of months. Doug Kelsey, president and CEO of both SkyTrain and West Coast Express, said "We take pride in maintaining clean trains and stations. We want the public to know we are not neglecting their system. However, at this important time we have a responsibility to take additional conservation steps."

For hygenic reasons, train interiors will be checked and cleaned nightly, and trains will be washed on a very selective basis as necessary.
