Celebrating Communities Stadium SkyTrain Station re-named

A re-dedication ceremony celebrating the name change of Stadium SkyTrain station to "Stadium – Chinatown" occurred on October 14, 2004. It included the unveiling of a new bilingual sign at the International Village entrance to the station. The event was well attended by community groups and local politicians, and highlighted by cultural entertainment from the Chinese community.

Requests to change the name of Stadium Station to "Stadium – Chinatown" came from the Vancouver Chinatown Merchant's Association, with support from local politicians. The primary reason for this request by the Chinatown community was to incorporate the historic and cultural aspect of the neighbourhood and promote the awareness of Chinatown to the community and tourists as they ride SkyTrain.

Community groups with an interest in and around Stadium Station were contacted to assess their level of support for the proposed name change. All were in favour of the - initiative and the TransLink Board approved the name change in June 2004.

In recent years, signage changes were done to the Main Street and Joyce Street SkyTrain stations in response to requests to recognize surrounding neighbourhoods and/or attractions. "Main Street" was re-dedicated "Main Street – Science World" and "Joyce Street" was changed to "Joyce Street – Collingwood".

Production for the new signage began in July. Installation was completed in two stages. The first stage began the week of September 27, 2004. The remaining signs were put up the week of October 11, 2004.

This name change supports the direction of connecting SkyTrain and its stations closer to the communities TransLink serves. The station name change further supports TransLink's commitment to enhanced liveability within our communities.

meeting, staff will be recommending ways to increase fare revenue by 6 per cent about \$41 million in the 2005-2007 period. The Board is being asked to approve sending the details

out for public comment.

It is proposed to introduce fare changes on January 1, 2005 except changes to U-Pass, which, if approved would be rolled-out next fall.

For 2005, staff is recommending:

- A freeze on FareSaver tickets and DayPasses, Concession fares for children and seniors and pre-paid HandyDART tickets for disabled pass.
- Raising cash fares by 25 cents for One and Two Zone travel and 50 cents for Three Zones.
- An increase of about 10 per cent for FareCard monthly passes.
- A \$2 per month increase in the U-Pass rate paid to TransLink (this could potentially involve some share of the increase between students and the universities).
- An increase in HandyDART cash fares by 25 cents for One, Two and Three Zone travel and by 50 cents for Four Zones.
- An increase in West Coast Express fares in line with those on conventional transit.

This approach should encourage a shift away from cash fares to more pre-paid fares, particularly FareSavers, which will provide a bigger discount. It will also help set the stage for the introduction of Smart Card technology, scheduled to be introduced in 2007-2008, using the technical capabilities of the new fareboxes and ticket vending machines.

The increase in fare revenue is one of three sources intended to fund the transit and road improvements in TransLink's next Three Year Plan, 2005-2007. The other two sources are the proposed tax on parking spaces, which will raise about \$70-million and the property tax increase - \$61 per year for an average home that will raise \$170 million over the three-year period.

Refinements to the proposed option or other alternatives may emerge during the public consultation process. However, at this time staff concluded that this option has the potential to best address the social, service and revenue needs to balance the trade-off between encouraging ridership and ensuring adequate revenue generation.
