Major Improvements have been proposed for the Vancouver/UBC transit service

A 25-member Public Advisory Committee, TransLink, UBC and the City of Vancouver collaborated to develop a plan which was produced after a series of public and stakeholder meetings.

The proposals from these meetings will now be submitted to Vancouver City Council on June 28th and to a public hearing in the council chamber on June 29th beginning at 7:30 pm.

#1207 Centennial Celebration

When interurban car #1207 emerged from the B.C. Electric Railway's New Westminster car shops in 1905, the population of what now makes up Greater Vancouver was barely one-twentieth of today's 2.1 million. Distinct communities and enclaves amidst large tracts of forest and undeveloped land had been only recently linked by electric interurban rail service. With a length of 15 m (50 ft), and weighing in at 32,000 kg (71,000 lbs) car 1207 spent most of the first half of the 20th century on the rails between Vancouver, Marpole, Eburne (Richmond) and Steveston. Avoiding the fate of her sisters, most of whom were scrapped upon the demise of interurban service in 1950's. 1207 survived, and was restored to operation on the Downtown Historic Railway in 1998. At a more relaxed pace than in her youth, 1207 now operates along the south shore of False Creek on weekends between Science World Station (adjacent to Main Street SkyTrain station and bus routes 3, 8 and 19) and Granville Island Station (bus 50). Call 604-665-3903 for 24-hour recorded information. The DHR is funded by the City of Vancouver, and is operated by volunteers from the Transit Museum Society, www.trams.bc.ca.

Would boarding be easier if you could use the lift?

The lifts on our accessible buses are not solely for wheelchair and scooter passengers; you can also take advantage of them if you are a pedestrian with a disability and have difficulty climbing steps....Simply request that the driver deploy the lift. It's necessary, however, that you are at an accessible stop on an accessible route. Accessible buses and stops carry a white decal showing the international wheelchair symbol.

If you are on a route served by New Flyer low-floor buses, you may not need to have the driver lower the ramp. The floor is just one step up and, if necessary, the bus can kneel to within a few inches of the sidewalk. If this is still too high, just request that the driver lower the ramp. Again, make sure you are at an accessible stop on an accessible route.
