Coast Moutain Bus service changes

To accommodate the Santa Parade route, all Howe St. buses will move to Granville St. and all Georgia St. buses will move to Pender St., from 9:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m.

SkyTrain service

SkyTrain will operate at rush-hour service frequency prior to the Santa Parade, and following the event.

Those travelling with a stroller are advised that elevator capacity at Burrard station is limited and there is no elevator at Granville station.

West Coast Express to parade
