

## Canada Line Construction Advisory

Construction work for the Canada Line is about to begin on No. 3 Road. Effective Feb. 6, the dedicated median bus lanes between Ackroyd and Bridgeport will be closed.

The #98 B Line will operate in the curb lane. Bus stops will be located as follows:

## Golden Ears Bridge Provides Improved Access to Regional Centres



The bridge will be a low-profile adaptation of the Alex Fraser cable-stayed bridge. The Golden Ears Bridge has a simpler cabling system that will ease construction and maintenance, and its composite steel deck frame will be lighter and less expensive than more traditional concrete superstructure alternatives.

**T**he Golden Ears Bridge, which is scheduled to open in June 2009, is a six-lane toll bridge that will cross the Fraser River and connect Pitt Meadows and Maple Ridge with Surrey and Langley.

The new bridge, and associated road network, will provide improved north-south access to regional centres and major trade routes like the Trans-Canada Highway. These improvements will provide better access to employment, markets, services, facilities and recreational opportunities to commuters throughout the region.

TransLink recently selected Golden Crossing Group as the preferred proponent to design, build, finance, operate, and maintain the Golden Ears Bridge and associated road network.

Golden Crossing Group provided the best-value proposal, meeting service and performance standards at the lowest cost to the region. Their fixed-price proposal assumes responsibility for construction cost over-runs, on-time delivery and operating performance.

Construction of the new bridge and road network is scheduled to begin this spring.

## Burrard SkyTrain Station Repairs

**C**ommuters are advised that during lighting and ceiling upgrades at Burrard Station there will be no escalator access from ticket level to upper level of the westbound platform.

From Feb. 3 to 10, between 7 p.m. Fridays and start of service Monday mornings, commuters using Burrard Station must use the emergency stairway or the elevator.
