The Vancouver years running Sun Run is the 1985-2009 0 second largest timed 10K in the world and the third largest timed run of any distance run in the world. A record 59,179 Sun Runners celebrated the 24th year of the event in 2008. 2009 promises to be bigger and better than ever!

SkyTrain will start 30 minutes early at rush-hour service levels. West Coast Express will operate a special Sun Run Express train,

The first train leaves King George at 6:38 a.m., arriving at Stadium Station by 7:15 a.m. Blue, yellow and green numbers should exit at Burrard; white, purple and red numbers are closer to Granville. leaving Mission City at 7 a.m., arriving at Waterfront at 8:15 a.m. and returning at 1 p.m.

SeaBus will also start an hour earlier, leaving Lonsdale Quay at 7:02 a.m. (northbound from Waterfront from 7:16 a.m.). It will run every 15 minutes, reverting to the regular 30-minute Sunday frequency after 2:30 p.m.

Regular Sunday fares are in effect, but on Sundays, an adult monthly FareCard or annual Employer Pass allows group travel of two adults and four children, or one adult and five children.
