Access Transit Strategy update

This is the sixth year since the start of the Access Transit Review, one of the most extensive reviews of accessible transportation by a transportation authority in North America.



The objective of increasing accessibility in the region has resulted in many milestones. Here are just a few:

2006 The Expo Line became fully accessible with the addition of an accessible elevator at the Granville Station.

2007 The 'Next Bus' service is launched. Since then, 30 million 'Next Bus' requests have helped customers receive real-time information on bus arrivals.

2008 Coast Mountain Bus Company's fleet officially became 100% wheelchair and scooter accessible.

2009 The Canada Line opens between Richmond, YVR and downtown Vancouver.

2010 Access Transit and CMBC expand their outreach strategy and provide more seniors and persons with disabilities access to bus training by travelling to central community locations.

2011 Access Transit organize public transit orientations for seniors and new immigrants.



Happy birthday **Buzzer!**

It's incredible that the first editon of the Buzzer came out on June 2, 1916! The Buzzer wasn't even the Buzzer then. That nameless first edition offered \$15 for the best suggestion of the name for the bulletin.



"To my knowledge the Buzzer is the oldest continuously-printed transit publication in the world. Ninety-five is an incredible run. The Buzzer came about as a reaction to what people called Jitneys. Jitneys were people who used their cars to make money off the transit system. They charged 5¢ (Jitney was slang for a nickel in the U.S.) to take transit passengers in their cars instead of the streetcars. The BC Electric Railway Company wanted to put on a better face for their customers, so the Buzzer was born." -- Jim McGraw, Executive of the Vancouver Historical Society and regular transit user.



Like Metro Vancouver, the Buzzer has changed over the years while continuing to cover topics of importance to transit riders. As Jim McGraw puts it, "The Buzzer has basically reflected the city. You can go back through issues and see what went on in the city."

Today, the Buzzer can be found on SkyTrain, West Coast Express and SeaBus. Online, back issues of the Buzzer can be downloaded at translink. ca. As well, the Buzzer blog is a popular place for news, conversation and topics of importance to transit riders.

What will the Buzzer look like at 100? We'll just have to wait and see. Until then, enjoy the latest edition of the Buzzer 95 years after the first!

Bus service will change on June 20

The following bus service changes take effect Monday, June 20. Please note that some routes will see PERMANENT changes that will reallocate service from time periods where demand is lower to boost capacity on high-demand routes as part of our ongoing service optimization, while other changes are SEASONAL to reflect changes in demand that take place each summer. For detailed info, maps and more, visit translink.ca, and go to "Schedules and Maps" and then "Transit Service Changes."

Vancouver, Burnaby & New Westminster

Granville Mall summer bus detours *SEASONAL* Transit services that normally travel along Granville Mall between Granville Bridge and Cordova Street will be detoured. Transit passengers will need to go to Seymour Street for northbound travel toward Waterfront or to Howe Street to head south toward the Granville Bridge. These detours will be in place Fridays after 9pm and all day Saturdays/Sundays/holidays from June 24 to September 5 and for two special-event Fridays (July 15 and August 19). These changes are in support of the "Viva Vancouver" program initiated by the City of Vancouver, which will transform downtown Granville Street into a pedestrian activity zone on weekends during the summer.

2 Burrard Station/Macdonald–16th Avenue *PERMANENT*

Mon to Fri: Increased peak period service, plus schedule coordination with the 22 Knight/Macdonald.

19 Stanley Park/Metrotown Station *SEASONAL*

Mon to Fri 8am-9pm and weekends/holidays 8am-7pm: additional trips between downtown Vancouver (Cambie at Pender) and Stanley Park.

28 Joyce Station/Phibbs Exchange/Capilano University *PFRMANFNT*

Mon to Fri: Service will begin 30 minutes earlier leaving Joyce Station at 5:15am.

99 B-Line UBC/Commercial-Broadway Station *PERMANENT* Sat/Sun and holidays: more frequent service from 7-8am.

North Shore

292 Upper Lynn Valley *PERMANENT*

Mon to Fri: All 292 routes will now run as 210 routes and all 290 routes will run as 211 routes with combined service every 7-8 minutes between downtown Vancouver and Phibbs Exchange during the pm peak. There will be no change to boarding locations as the 210 and 211 use the same stops as existing 292 and 290 services.

232 Grouse Mountain/Phibbs Exchange *PERMANENT*

Mon to Fri: First westbound trip will start from Keith Road and Grand Boulevard at 5:33am. Saturday service will start westbound from Phibbs Exchange at 6:47am and eastbound from Grouse Mountain at 7:07am.

239 Capilano University/Park Royal *PERMANENT*

Mon to Sun: Evening service on the 239 will be increased to every 15 minutes until 9pm. All trips will serve Capilano University.

242 Upper Lonsdale/Vancouver

N24 Upper Lonsdale/Downtown NightBus *PERMANENT* Late-evening 242 trips will be renumbered as N24. Times for these trips remain the same.

246 Lonsdale Quay/Highland/Vancouver *PERMANENT*All

trips on the 246 will operate to and from downtown Vancouver. Park Royal-bound passengers on the 246 will transfer to the 239 and/or 255 on Marine Drive at Garden Road. Service after 7pm will be revised to operate every 60 minutes.

Richmond

401 Garden City/One Road *PERMANENT*

Sat/Sun and holidays: Early morning trips will now start from Chatham at 5:06am and Riverport at 5:18am.

403 Bridgeport Station/Three Road *PERMANENT*

Mon to Sun: First northbound trip will now start from Riverport at 4:39am, arriving at Bridgeport Station at 5:15am (No earlier trips from Steveston Hwy at Seaward).

602 Tsawwassen Heights/Bridgeport Station

603 Beach Grove/Bridgeport Station

604 English Bluff/Bridgeport Station *PERMANENT*

Mon-Fri: Improved coordination of schedules will provide more consistent service and more predictable wait times between South Delta Rec Centre and Bridgeport Station.

Surrey/Delta/White Rock

Newton Exchange Bays 2 and 3 *PERMANENT*

Bus assignments will be switched between Newton Exchange Bays 2 and 3. Board the 301 Richmond-Brighouse Station and 341 Langley Centre at Bay 2; board the 321 Surrey Central Station at Bay 3.

Tri-Cities/Maple Ridge/Pitt Meadows

C26 Buntzen Lake Special/Coquitlam Station Special

SEASONAL

Sat/Sun and holidays: Hourly seasonal service for Buntzen Lake returns June 25 through to September 5 (Labour Day).

West Coast Express TrainBus

Mon-Fri: Some TrainBus trips will terminate at Port Haney Station and no longer extend to Mission. Sat/Sun/holidays: No TrainBus service. The 701 Maple Ridge East/Haney Place/Coguitlam Stn provides frequent local bus service plus connections for downtown Vancouver via Coguitlam Station. *PERMANENT*

Clean Air Day

Why are Coast Mountain Bus Company (CMBC) operators wearing buttons on June 8? It's for two reasons: it's Clean Air Day, and they're celebrating their award-winning achievement of having reduced the amount of bus idling every single month over the same month the previous year. Last year, the CMBC Idling Policy asked operators to turn off their buses if they expected to idle at a bus stop or loop for more than three minutes. It was such a success that the program won the Canadian Urban Transit Association's (CUTA) National Transit Corporate Recognition Award for 2011!
