Here's an excerpt from the August 7, 1931 issue of the Buzzer that says as much about the fashion of the day as it does about the time period.

sock. Whether this is in retaliation upon the female of the species for wearing beach pyjamas or merely to demand emancipation from the limitations of



male attire, the despatches do not say. We imagine the advantages of going about sockless. For instance, if the elastic in your garters has practically evaporated, you need never experience that sinking feeling of your sock nestling down around your ankles...

Anyway, it is only right that the men folk should share in this emancipation that the women have been enjoying for so long. The ads have been telling us how drudgery in the kitchen has been abolished and how the lady can now enjoy the glorious freedom of the golf course or the gossip of the bridge table. Why not the men?

GoCard and student passes

Full-time public and private school secondary students ages 14 through 19 (inclusive) in Grades 8 to 12 (inclusive) or enrolled in Grade 8 at the start of the school year are eligible for a GoCard. GoCards allows students to receive concession fares on the bus, SkyTrain, SeaBus and WestCoast Express. Photographs for the cards will be taken for free during in-school sessions. The cards will be issued for free if issued at in-school sessions.

If you miss your in-school session, a GoCard can be issued immediately at various locations for \$11. Students must provide a GoCard application form (available at school offices) signed by a school official along with proof of age (birth certificate, passport or CareCard).
