Yes, smiles will then abide where only frowns were found.



Bus service changes coming in June

We adjust our bus service four times a year to match ebbs and flows in customer demand, and to ensure we're using our resources effectively. Here are the changes coming on June 25, 2012—in general, look out for bus service changes in April, June, September, and December.

This list is accurate as of our publish date: please check *translink.ca* or call Transit Information at 604-953-3333 for corrections or further assistance. Some changes are SEASONAL, PERMANENT or noted otherwise.

2 Macdonald-16th Avenue/Burrard Station PERMANENT

Improved schedule coordination with route 22 to provide more consistent service. And on Saturdays, 20-minute service will be extended until 9pm

Granville Mall weekend/holiday detours SEASONAL

From June 23 to Sept 3, the City of Vancouver will close Granville Mall to traffic all day on Sat/Sun/holidays. As a result, the bus services listed above will be detoured onto Seymour Street northbound and Howe Street southbound. The regular Friday detours after 9pm remain in effect for the above routes.

5 Downtown/Robson SEASONAL

N6 Downtown/West End SEASONAL

From June 30 to Sept 3, the City of Vancouver will close Robson Square to traffic, detouring the 5 and N6. From Robson, the 5 Downtown trip will detour primarily via Burrard and Pender before terminating on Richards at Hastings. The 5 Robson trip will detour via Pender and Burrard to Robson. The N6 Downtown route will detour via Burrard northbound and Pender eastbound to Homer, then returning via Pender westbound to Howe. The N6 West End trip remains on its regular route.
