

New penalties for fare evasion

Keep your proof of payment handy! As of September 4, TransLink has taken over responsibility for fare evasion and fine collection from the Province, bringing changes in how we deal with fare evasion.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- 1. Keep your proof of payment handy. You could be asked to show it at any time.
- 2. Failure to show a valid proof of payment could cost you a \$173 fine.
- 3. If left unpaid, this fine amount escalates.
- 4. Outstanding fines may be sent to a collection agency.
- 5. ICBC may refuse to issue or renew your driver's licence or vehicle insurance if you have outstanding fines.

Robson Square will remain closed to buses after Labour Day. Therefore, the 5 and N6 will remain on their current routes including stops on Burrard St and Pender St.
