On **Monday, July 1, 2013** all transit will run on a Sunday schedule. West Coast Express, like the AirCare Inspection Centres, will not be in operation.

A Sunday schedule means you can ride multiple zones on a single fare ticket. As well, on Sundays and holidays, if you have an adult FareCard, West Coast Express 28-Day Pass, or Annual Employer Transit Pass you can take five children, or one adult and four children, on transit with you for free.

# Summer transit service starts Monday June 24

Four times a year in April, June, September and December, TransLink updates its bus service schedules to match seasonal demand and make efficient use of our fleet.

All the changes listed below take effect on June 24, 2013 except where noted otherwise. Some changes are **SEASONAL**, **PERMANENT**, **TEMPORARY** or noted otherwise.

## 4 Powell/Downtown TEMPORARY

Construction on Powell Street means the 4 will now operate via Clark St. and Hastings St until summer 2014. Service via Powell St. is discontinued.

## 4 UBC/Downtown TEMPORARY

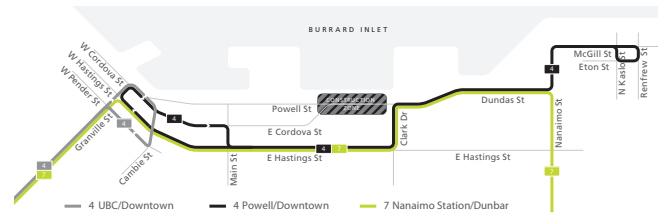
Construction on Powell Street downtown trips will continue to operate between UBC and Waterfront Station only until summer 2014 as follows:

- » Customers travelling further east from Waterfront Station, need to transfer from 4 Downtown to 4 Powell at the stop located on the south side of Cordova Street at Seymour Street.
- » Customers travelling further west from Waterfront Station need to transfer from the 4 Downtown to the 4 UBC at the stop located on the South side of Cordova Street at Seymour Street.

Shuttle service will operate approximately every 15 minutes and a little less frequently in the evenings.

## 5 Robson/Downtown SEASONAL N6 West End/Downtown SEASONAL

Summer events taking place at Robson Square require the closure of the roadway. The 5 Robson/Downtown and N6 West End/Downtown will detour at the 800 Block Robson Street from June 24 to Labour Day (September 2, 2013).



Reroutes for the 4 and 7, owing to construction on Powell Street at Clark Drive.

- 4 UBC/Downtown **SEASONAL**
- 6 Davie/Downtown **SEASONAL**
- 7 Nanaimo/Dunbar **SEASONAL**
- 10 Granville/Downtown **SEASONAL**
- 14 UBC/Hastings/Downtown **SEASONAL**
- 16 Arbutus/29th Avenue Station **SEASONAL**
- 20 Victoria/Downtown **SEASONAL**
- 50 Waterfront Station/False Creek South **SEASONAL**

Granville Mall will be closed on summer weekends owing to the City of Vancouver's Viva Vancouver program, meaning weekend reroutes for all routes using this street. The detours will take place all day Saturday, Sunday and holidays beginning the week of June 24 to Labour Day (September 2, 2013), using Seymour Street northbound and Howe Street southbound. The diagram on the right describes the summer changes.

## 7 Nanaimo/Dunbar TEMPORARY

Construction on Powell Street prompts the following changes until summer 2014:

- » 7 Nanaimo will detour eastbound via Hastings Street using existing stops between Granville Street and Clark Drive, then go north along Clark to Powell, then continue on the regular route to Nanaimo Station.
- » 7 Dunbar will operate on the regular route to Powell Street at Clark Drive, then detour along Clark Drive to Hastings Street using existing stops between Clark Drive and Granville Street, then continue along the regular route from Granville Street to Dunbar Loop.

## 209/210 Upper Lynn Valley/Vancouver TEMPORARY

Construction on Powell Street prompts the following changes until summer 2014:

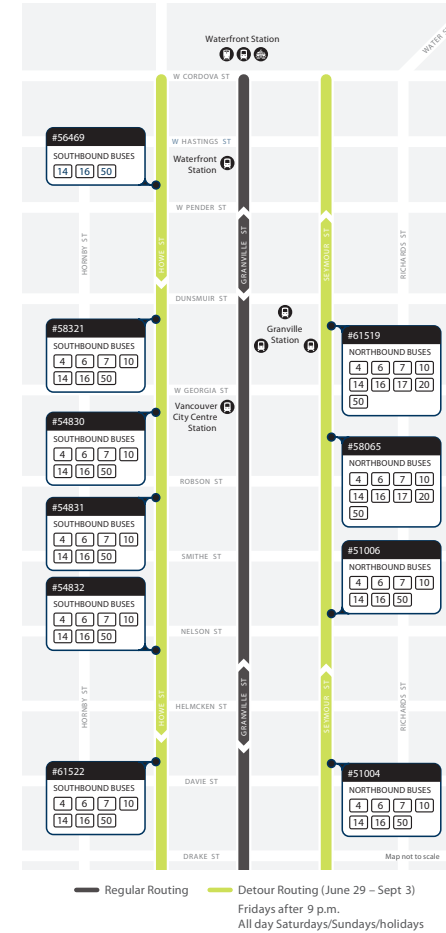
- » 209 Upper Lynn Valley will detour from Homer Street at Pender via Homer, Hastings Street, Clark Drive, then regular route, using existing stops in the detour portion.
- » 209 Vancouver will detour from Powell Street at Clark Drive via Clark, Hastings Street, Howe Street then regular route, using existing stops in the detour portion.
- » 210 Vancouver will detour from Powell Street at Clark Drive via Clark, Hastings Street, Howe Street then regular route, using existing stops in the detour portion.
- » 210 Upper Lynn Valley will detour from Homer Street at Pender via Homer, Hastings Street, Clark Drive, then regular route, using existing stops in the detour portion.

## 211 Vancouver/Seymour/Phibbs Exchange TEMPORARY

## 214 Vancouver/Blue Ridge/Phibbs Exchange TEMPORARY

Construction on Powell Street prompts the following changes until summer 2014:

- » 211 Vancouver and 214 Vancouver will detour from Powell Street at Clark Drive via Clark, Hastings Street, Howe Street then regular route, using existing stops in the detour portion.
- » 211 Seymour/Phibbs Exchange and 214 Blue Ridge/Phibbs Exchange will detour from Homer Street at Pender via Homer, Hastings Street, Clark Drive, then regular route, using existing stops in the detour portion.

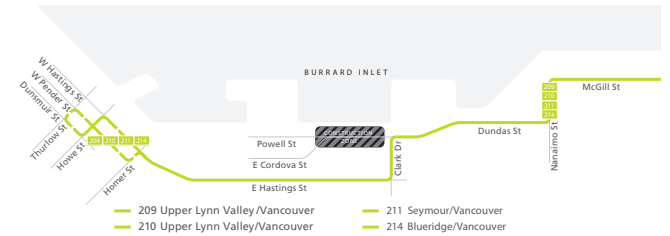


Granville Mall street closures mean weekend reroutes for the 4, 6, 7, 10, 14, 16, 20, and 50.

## 316 Scottsdale/Surrey Central Station PERMANENT

To improve entering and exiting at Scottsdale Exchange the 316 Surrey Central Station/Scottsdale route will be updated as follows:

- » 316 Surrey Central now enters Scottsdale Exchange via Scott Road then 74 Ave. Bus stops 55042 and 55043 on 122 St and 72 Ave are no longer in use. Please use Bay 2 at Scottsdale Exchange or stop 54794 on 72 Ave at Scott Road.
- » 316 Scottsdale now departs Scottsdale Exchange Bay 2 via Scott Road, 72 Ave, 116 St then regular route to Scott Road Station. Bus stops 54941 and 54942 located on 72 Ave and 122 St are no longer in use. Customers can board this route at Scottsdale Exchange Bay 2, or stop 54865 on 72 Avenue at Scott Road.



Reroutes for the 209, 210, 211 and 214, owing to construction on Powell Street.

## Burrard Station Bus Bay Reassignments TEMPORARY

Due to the detour of 5 Robson/Downtown and N6 Downtown bus bay reassignments are as follows:

- » 5 Robson will load at Bay 1
- » 5 Downtown and N6 Downtown will load at Bay 5

## SeaBus SEASONAL

Sunday and holidays: from May 19 to Labour Day (September 2, 2013), SeaBus service will increase service to every 15 minutes between 10 a.m. and 6:30 p.m.

## Transit to Celebration of Light

Expect some large crowds for the three nights of the Honda Celebration of Light. This year, United Kingdom (July 27), Canada (July 31) and Thailand (August 3) will compete. Expect rush-hour levels of SkyTrain service, more SeaBus sailings and extra buses to and from downtown before and after the event.
