The Buzzer turned 98 on June 2! In this section, we mine the back issues for historical treats. Eniov!

The June 30, 1967 edition of The Buzzer celebrated the opening of the Kensington Transit Centre. The what?

Today, Friday, June 30, buses begin to operate out of Kensington Transit Centre. This is a new transportation centre at Sprott and Kensington in Burnaby. The site was selected as central to serve the Burnaby-New Westminster Area. The old bus centre at the foot of 12th Street hill in New Westminster has been closed.

Kensinaton Transit Centre consists of almost eight acres of property. There is a garage building of 12,000 square feet where a crew of 18 service-men and mechanics will operate three shifts a day, seven days a week to service and maintain 80 buses which are now operating



out of the centre. Ultimate capacity is 200 buses.

The Kensington Transit Centre would close in 1986 after 19 years of service and its operations would move to the brand-new Burnaby Transit Centre at 3855 Kitchener Street.

The Buzzer celebrates its 98th birthday!

The Buzzer published its very first issue on June 2nd, 1916—without a name I might add—by the British Columbia Electric Railway Company. It was simply titled, "Wanted—A Name" and a contest was held to find a name.

You guessed it! The Buzzer was the winner and it was unveiled in the following issue. Eleven different people received a \$2 first prize for suggesting the name!

The Buzzer was launched to help advertise the advantages of taking streetcars over jitneys, private citizens who patrolled streetcar routes and offered rides for five cents. Jitneys were banned in July 1918, but the Buzzer kept going and is now in its 98th year in print! Happy Birthday!

Four times a year (April, June, September and December), TransLink updates its bus service schedules to reflect seasonal changes in customer demand, and to optimize service.

All the changes listed below take effect on June 23, 2014 except where noted otherwise. Changes are noted as SEASONAL or PERMANENT. Please note that for seasonal closures, regular service will resume in September

005 Robson/Downtown SEASONAL

- Eastbound buses will detour via Davie, Denman, Robson, Burrard, Pender, Homer, Hastings and Richards.
- Westbound buses will detour via Richards, Pender, Burrard, Robson, Denman and Davie.

019 Metrotown Station/Stanley Park SEASONAL

- A downtown shuttle service operates on this route between West Pender St. and Cambie St. to Stanley Park. When combined with the regular 19 Metrotown Station/Stanley Park service, frequency between downtown and Stanley Park is as follows:
- > Weekdays: every 6-7 mins from 8 am- 5 p.m., 5 mins from 5-6 pm and 6 mins from 6-9 pm.
- > Weekends: every 6 mins from 8 am to 7 pm

041 Joyce Station/UBC PERMANENT

- On Saturday, service increases to every 7.5 mins from 6–11 am and 12 mins from 6–8 pm.
- On Sunday, service increases to every 7.5 mins from 9 am-6 pm and 12 mins from 6-9 pm.

049 Dunbar Loop/UBC/Metrotown Station PERMANENT

 On Saturday frequency increases to every 10 mins between 6–9 pm and 20 mins between 9 pm–12 am.

099 B-Line Commercial-Broadway Station/UBC PERMANENT

- Weekday frequency increases to every 5 mins between 6-8 pm, 6 mins between 8-9 pm and 7 mins between 9-10 pm.
- Saturday frequency increases to every 7 mins between 8-9 am, every 6 mins between 9-10 am and every 7 mins between 5-8 pm.

178 Coquitlam Station/Port Moody Station PERMANENT

 Service reroutes at David Ave. between Noon's Creek and Johnson St. and now runs along Panorama Dr. instead of along David Ave.

311 Bridgeport Station/Scottsdale PERMANENT

• Weekday service operates every 20 mins from 6-7 am and 3-5 pm, and 15 mins from 7-8 am.

337 Fraser Heights/Guildford/Surrey Central PERMANENT

• Moves from Bay 9 to Bay 5a at Surrey Central Station.

352 Bridgeport Station/Ocean Park PERMANENT

• Weekday service operates every 15 mins on the quarter from 6-7 am.

395 King George Station/Willowbrook PERMANENT

 This bus no longer stops at Surrey Central Station in the PM, instead it leaves from Bay 3 at King George Station.

502 Surrey Central Station/Langley Centre - Route Truncation PERMANENT

- This service only operates between Surrey Central Station and Langley Centre, with limited peak-hour trips to/from Brookswood.
- Customers may alternatively use the NEW 503 Surrey Central Station/ Aldergrove express service for limited stops between Surrey and Langley and local travel between Langley and Aldergrove.

503 Surrey Central Station/Alder grove PERMANENT New Express Service!

- This NEW express bus serves Langley and Aldergrove with connections to Surrey and departs from Bay 9 at Surrey Central Station. The Salmon River detour is discontinued.
- > Pick up service only at key stops eastbound between Surrey Central Station and Langley Centre
- > Drop off service only at key stops, westbound between Langley Centre and Surrey Central Station



Don't Touch the Operator

In March, the Metro Vancouver Transit Police launched a campaign aimed at bringing awareness to assaults and harassment towards bus operators called "Don't Touch the Operator."

The message is clear. Any harassment, intimidation, threats, or assaults on bus operators will not be tolerated, and that the Transit Police will vigorously investigate all reports.

The campaign will run indefinitely and includes ongoing efforts from each of the agencies involved. Decals will be placed in all Coast Mountain Buses displaying strong messages that speak to the issue.

Introducing: Burrard Otter II, our new SeaBus!



The Burrard Otter II is the first SeaBus to be built to a Classification Society Standard (Lloyd's Register), and it was designed by noted Vancouver, B.C.-based naval architectural firm Robert Allan Ltd.

The vessel has just completed sea trials in Singapore, and will soon be prepared for shipment to Vancouver on a BBC Chartering heavylift carrier. The new SeaBus will arrive at Port Metro Vancouver by late July.

Before being put into service, the Burrard Otter II will go through more sea trials to make sure it's in tip top shape and SeaBus employees will be trained on operations and maintenance of the new vessel.

Following an inspection by Transport Canada, the Burrard Otter II will go into regular service, currently scheduled for fall.

The Burrard Otter II will share duties with the Burrard Pacific Breeze, which made its maiden voyage on December 23, 2009. The original Burrard Otter will be retired from active service, and the Burrard Beaver will be retrofitted and used as a spare vessel.
