#### **ELEVATOR UPGRADES**

The elevator at Metrotown Station is out of service until early 2016 while we upgrade the station and build three new elevators.

Bus-shuttle service is now in place for customers who need help getting between the stations:

- » Passengers with disabilities can take a HandyDART shuttle between the Metrotown and Patterson Station HandyDART stops.
- » Passengers travelling with strollers can take a Community Shuttle to Metrotown Station from Patterson or Royal Oak Stations.

The shuttles run approximately every 15 to 20 minutes during the following times:

- » Monday to Friday: 6 am to 10 pm
- » Saturday: 9 am to 10 pm
- » Sundays and holidays: 9 am to 8 pm

# **An update from Transit Police**

#### Don't Just Sit There—Text Something!

Last year, Transit Police launched the *See Something, Say Something* campaign alongside the SMS Text 87-77-77 messaging system and the OnDuty app for smartphones. Customers frequently use both the text line and OnDuty app to report issues on transit.

In 2014, customers sent Transit Police 30,971 text messages. This means that officers were deployed 1,703 times and responded to 2,370 incidents. On average, Transit Police receive one text message every 25 minutes.



Use the OnDuty app or text 87-77-77 to report **non-emergency** issues such as: suspicious circumstances, public drinking, drugs, fights or harassment. If you feel that your safety or that of another is in immediate jeopardy or are in any doubt, always call 911.

# **Summer Service Changes June 22, 2015**

Four times a year (April, June, September and December), TransLink updates its transit service schedules to reflect seasonal changes in customer demand and to optimize service.

#### All the changes listed below take effect on June 22, 2015.

#### 005 Robson/Downtown SEASONAL

The regular route will detour in both directions to accommodate the City of Vancouver's closure of 800 Robson at Robson Square from June 20 to Labour Day.

#### 019 Metrotown Station/Stanley Park SEASONAL

A downtown shuttle service between West Pender Street and Cambie Street provides more frequent service to Stanley Park. The regular 19 Metrotown Station/Stanley Park service remains on its usual schedule.

#### 100 Marpole Loop/22nd Street Station PERMANENT

More frequent weekday service during the 30 minutes before and after AM and PM peak service periods, 6-6:30 am and 9-9:30 am and 2:30-3 pm and 6-6:30 pm.

#### 129 Patterson Station/Edmonds Station TEMPORARY

The 129 will end/begin at Patterson Station, and will no longer stop along Central Boulevard, between Metrotown Station and Willingdon Avenue. As an alternative, customers can transfer between the 129 and SkyTrain at Patterson Station, or get on one of the temporary shuttles available for passengers with mobility devices or strollers who are travelling between Patterson and Metrotown Stations.

#### 135 SFU/Burrard Station and N35 Downtown/SFU PERMANENT

Late-night service increases on Saturday nights to every 20 minutes between 1-3 am (Saturday night/Sunday morning).

#### 227 Lynn Valley Centre/Phibbs Exchange SEASONAL

Summer transit service to Lynn Canyon Park on weekends and holidays, starting on June 27. This one-way route departs Lynn Valley Centre every 30 minutes starting at 12:10 pm, travelling to Lynn Canyon Park and then back again via Ross Road, with last trip departing the park at 7:10 pm.

#### 335 Surrey Central Station/Newton Exchange PERMANENT

More service on weekday evenings: two new weekday trips at 6:30 pm and 6:55 pm, and the weekday 9:40 pm trip from Surrey Central to Guildford now extends to Newton Exchange.

#### 351 Bridgeport Station/Crescent Beach PERMANENT

The 5:31 am and 6:56 am weekday trips will end at White Rock Centre and then turn back north to Bridgeport Station.

#### 395 King George Station/Langley Centre PERMANENT

The route has been renamed and now extends past 200th Street and 64th Avenue to travel directly to Langley Centre.

#### 555 Carvolth Exchange/Lougheed Station PERMANENT

Two new trips added to extend late evening service to Carvolth Exchange and Lougheed Station, with the last daily trip now arriving in both locations just before 12 am.

The route will now travel between Carvolth Exchange and Lougheed Station and no longer stop at Braid Station. The new bus-only ramps at Brunette Interchange are expected to keep travel times the same as for the previous route.

#### C20 Totem Park/UBC Loop TEMPORARY

One new stop has been added between NW Marine Drive at Agronomy Road and NW Marine Drive at University Boulevard, at the mid-point along Lower Mall north of Bio Science Road.

#### C26 Buntzen Lake Special/Coquitlam Station Special SEASONAL

Beginning June 27, weekend/holiday service between Buntzen Lake and Coquitlam Station operates every 60 minutes. The first bus leaves Coquitlam Station at 9:37 am, and the last bus leaves Buntzen Lake at 7:05 pm.

This seasonal service shares route portions and a bus number with the C26. The regular route drops-off at Port Moody Station and Belcarra Rd at Whiskey Cove Lane.

#### C52 Seaside/White Rock Centre SEASONAL

Increased service to the beach seven days a week. The community shuttle will run every 30 minutes on weekdays 9 am to 3 pm, Saturdays 8 am to midnight and Sundays/holidays 8 am to 10 pm.

#### N6 West End/Downtown SEASONAL

To accommodate road closures of the 800 block of Robson by the City of Vancouver, this route will detour both eastbound and westbound from June 20 to Labour Day.
