# Bus Anywhere with a One-Zone Fare

Starting October 5, bus-only trips — no matter the time of the day— will only cost you a onezone fare. And, if you're using Compass, you won't need to tap out when exiting a bus.

Whether you're paying by cash, FareSaver, Stored Value on a Compass Card, or a Monthly Pass, you'll only need to pay for one zone of travel on buses across the system.

Just like today, the same transfer window applies, so you'll have 90 minutes to transfer to another bus without having to pay a new fare.

If you transfer to SkyTrain and don't cross a zone boundary, your journey will still only cost a one-zone fare. If you cross a zone boundary or boundaries while on SkyTrain or SeaBus, you'll need to pay for the extra zone(s).

As Compass rolls out over the next few months, this bus-fare change will help customers adjust to tapping with their cards. Starting October 5, Compass users riding the bus will only have to tap as they board—but don't have to tap off the bus!

This means you'll only pay for the travel you've taken.

Fares stay the same for travel on SkyTrain, SeaBus, Canada Line and West Coast Express, where Compass users will have to tap in and tap out.

Four times a year (April, June, September and December), TransLink updates its transit service schedules to reflect seasonal changes in customer demand and to optimize service.

#### All the changes listed below take effect on September 7, 2015.

#### **3 Downtown/Main PERMANENT**

Increased service for weeknight trips every 20 minutes until 1:30 a.m.

#### 5 Robson/Downtown SEASONAL

With the completion of the VIVA Program, service on Robson Street between Burrard and Seymour streets returns, effective September 8, 2015.

#### 14 Hastings/UBC PERMANENT

Increased service will now offer weeknight trips every 15 minutes between 12 a.m. to 1:30 a.m.

#### 25 Brentwood Station/UBC SEASONAL

All AM peak trips between Brentwood Station and UBC run every 7-8 minutes.

Service between Nanaimo Station and UBC run every 4 minutes.

Trips from King Edward Ave/Granville St. to Willingdon Ave/Canada Way at 7:48, 7:59 and 8:07 a.m. returns.

#### 135 SFU/Burrard Station PERMANENT

Service is increased to offer a new weeknight trip at 1 a.m.

#### 143 SFU/Coquitlam Station SEASONAL

AM and PM peak trips operate every 10 minutes.

Extended evening service returns - the last trip leaves SFU at 10 p.m.

145 Production Way/SFU SEASONAL Trips to SFU operate from 7:50 to 11:30 a.m. and 3:40 to 6:00 p.m.

**210 Upper Lynn Valley/Vancouver SEASONAL** AM trips leaving Burrard Station at 6:20, 6:50, 7:05, 7:17, 7:29, 7:41, 7:53, 8:05, 8:20, 8:35 and 8:50 a.m. return.

#### 222 Montroyal/Edgemont (Capilano Road Shuttle) TEMPORARY

Capilano Road will be temporarily closed between Ridgewood Drive and Montroyal Boulevard due to regional water main construction. Construction is expected to be completed by Spring 2016.

Detoured routes include:

- » 232 Grouse Mountain/Phibbs Exchange
- » 236 Grouse Mountain/Pemberton Heights/Lonsdale Quay
- » 247 Upper Capilano/Vancouver

Transit service along Capilano Road between Ridgewood Boulevard and Montroyal Boulevard will be provided by a temporary shuttle route (222).

The shuttle can be boarded for southbound or northbound travel, with accessibility of stops dependent on current location of the "moving roadblock." (Portions of street will be open as construction completes.)

Passengers can transfer to the 222 at:

- » Montroyal Boulevard at Belvedere Drive for the 232 and 236
- » Cliffridge Avenue at Montroyal Boulevard for the 247
- » Edgemont Village Highland Boulevard at Woodbine Drive

#### 232 Grouse Mountain/Phibbs Exchange TEMPORARY

The 232 will be detoured from the regular route to accommodate regional water main construction on Capilano Road between Ridgewood Drive and Montroyal Boulevard. Construction is expected to be completed by Spring 2016.

The route will detour from Capilano Road via Edgemont Boulevard, Highland Boulevard and Montroyal Boulevard, then back to Capilano Road, increasing the route by 0.6 kilometres.

The detour route has no new stops, except for eastbound Montroyal Boulevard at Belvedere Drive.

Passengers wishing to access the regular route stops along Capilano Road can transfer to the temporary 222 Montroyal/Edgemont community shuttle at Edgemont Village (Highland Boulevard at Woodbine Drive) for northbound travel, or Montroyal Boulevard at Belvedere Drive for southbound travel.

#### 236 Grouse Mountain/Pemberton Heights/Lonsdale Quay TEMPORARY

The 236 will be detoured from the regular route to accommodate regional water main construction on Capilano Road between Ridgewood Drive and Montroyal Boulevard. Construction is expected to be completed Spring 2016.

The route will detour from Capilano Road via Ridgewood Drive, Edgemont Boulevard, Highland Boulevard and Montroyal Boulevard then back to Capilano Road, increasing the route by 0.6 kilometres.

The detour route has no new stops, except for eastbound Montroyal Boulevard at Belvedere Drive.

Passengers wishing to access the regular route stops along Capilano Road can transfer to the temporary 222 Montroyal/Edgemont shuttle at Edgemont Village (Highland Boulevard at Woodbine Drive) for northbound travel, or Montroyal Boulevard at Belvedere Drive for southbound travel.

#### 247 Upper Capilano/Vancouver TEMPORARY

The 247 will be detoured from the regular route to accommodate regional water main construction on Capilano Road between Ridgewood Drive and Montroyal Boulevard. Construction is expected to be completed by Spring 2016.

The route will detour from Capilano Road via Ridgewood Drive, Edgemont Boulevard, Highland Boulevard and Montroyal Boulevard then back to Capilano Road, increasing the route by approximately 1.8 kilometres. The detour route has no new stops.

Passengers wishing to access the regular route stops along Capilano Road can transfer to the temporary 222 Montroyal/Edgemont shuttle at Edgemont Village (Highland Boulevard at Woodbine Drive) for northbound travel, or Cliffridge Avenue at Montroyal Boulevard for southbound travel.

#### 403 Bridgeport Station/Three Road PERMANENT

Saturday service is increased to offer trips every 15 minutes between 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.

#### C20 Marine Drive/UBC Loop PERMANENT

Increased weekday service offers trips every 15 minutes between 4 to 8 p.m.

#### C63 Fernridge/Langley Centre PERMANENT

The route is maintained as an hourly service, and the extra morning trip is discontinued (leaving Langley Centre at 7:55 a.m. and returning from 198 Street/24 Avenue at 8:15 a.m.).

#### N8 Downtown/Fraser TEMPORARY

Effective Monday, August 10, the N8 will detour off Pender St. due to water main construction. Passengers can catch their bus on West Hastings St.
