1987 The July 3, 1987 issue celebrated a new generation of buses entering service!

BC Transit recently took delivery of 28 new GM Classic buses. The Classic is the first new GM bus design since 1959, when the familiar ‘New Look’, which has been the backbone of Greater Vancouver’s diesel fleet since 1961, first came off the assembly line.



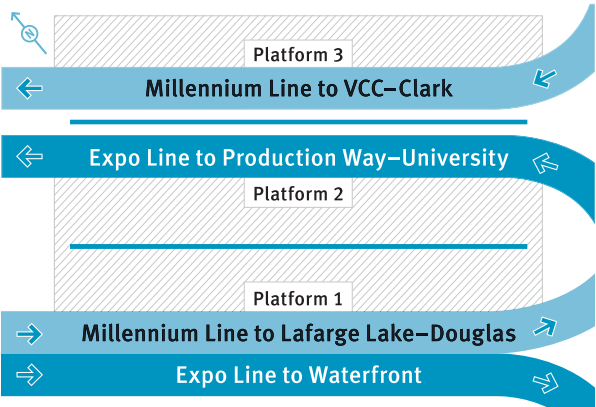
In 2018, we’re receiving 106 compressed natural gas (CNG) buses—all of which will be operating out of Surrey Transit Centre!

New platform assignments for Millennium Line at Lougheed

Starting June 25, Millennium Line trains to Lafarge Lake–Douglas Station will depart from Platform 1 and trains to VCC–Clark Station will depart from Platform 3.

Customers should follow station signage to ensure they are waiting at the correct platform to catch their Millennium Line train. Expo Line trains will continue to use Platform 1 and 2.

This new configuration will allow trains to operate through Lougheed Town Centre Station more efficiently.

Summer Service Changes begin June 25

Four times a year (*each spring, summer, fall and winter*), TransLink makes bus service changes to reflect seasonal changes in demand and to add more service to where our customers need it most.

10-YEAR VISION IMPROVEMENT (PERMANENT)

319 Scott Road/ Newton Exchange

We heard you! We’re increasing service at busy times on weekdays to reduce wait times and pass-ups.

- » Weekdays:
 - Every 7-15 mins. between 5pm– 11pm
 - Up from every 8-20 mins. between 5pm – 11pm

SEASONAL IMPROVEMENTS

We’re adding extra trips on myriad routes to get you to and from popular summer attractions!

15 Cambie/Olympic Village

- » Saturdays: 11am-8pm: every 12 mins.
- » Sundays: 12pm-7pm: every 12 mins.

19 Downtown/Stanley Park (between West Pender & Cambie and Stanley Park Loop)

We’re adding extra trips on the 19 route between downtown Vancouver (W Pender St. & Cambie St.) and Stanley Park! When combined with the regular 19 Metrotown Station/Stanley Park service, frequency between downtown and Stanley Park is as follows:

- » Weekdays:
 - Every 6-7 mins. from 10am – 5pm
 - Every 5 mins. from 5-6 pm
 - Every 6 mins. from 6-9 pm
- » Weekends:
 - Every 5-6 mins. from 9am–7pm

23 Main St/Yaletown/Beach

- » Weekdays: 7pm–8:30pm, every 12 mins.
- » Saturdays: 1pm–6pm, every 10 mins.
- » Sundays: 1pm–8pm, every 10 mins.

50 Waterfront/False Creek South

- » Saturdays: 11am–8pm, every 12 mins.
- » Sundays: 12pm–7pm, every 12 mins.

150 White Pine Beach/ Coquitlam Central Station

- » Weekdays: 9:30am–7:30pm, every 60 mins.
- » Weekends: 9:30am–7:30pm, every 60 mins.

620 Tsawwassen Ferry/ Bridgeport Station

- » Fridays:
 - Last trip to the ferry: 11pm
 - Last trip from the ferry: 12am
- » Saturdays:
 - Last trip to the ferry: 10:05pm
 - Last trip from the ferry: 11pm
- » Sundays:
 - Last trip to the ferry: 11pm
 - Last trip from the ferry: 12am

RENAMED ROUTES

We’re renaming these routes to improve customer experience for new riders! Buses will operate exactly the same, only the destination sign will change. Customers can remain on the bus when the route number changes.

560 Langley Centre/ Murrayville and 561 Langley Centre/Brookswood

The C60 and C61 routes are now the 560 Langley Centre/Murrayville and 561 Langley Centre/Brookswood

- » 560 route will service north-eastern portion of the loop
- » 561 route will service south-western portion of the loop

745 Haney Place/Cottonwood and 746 Haney Place/Albion

The C45 and C46 routes are now the 745 Haney Place/Cottonwood and 746 Haney Place/Albion

- » 745 route will service north-eastern portion of the loop
- » 746 route will service south-western portion of the loop

ROUTE ADJUSTMENTS

20 Victoria/Downtown (Layover Pilot Project)

We heard you and we’re trying something new! Congestion in downtown Vancouver often affects this route’s reliability. That’s why we’re piloting a layover on Richards Street at W Georgia Street. This provides buses on the 20 with buffer time to get back on schedule.

44 UBC/Downtown

To provide express service downtown, the 44 will no longer serve five bus stops:

- » Stop #50045 – SB Burrard St FS Robson St
- » Stop #50046 – SB Burrard St NS Barclay St
- » Stop #50073 – NB Burrard St FS Pacific St
- » Stop #56558 – NB Burrard St FS Dunsmuir St
- » Stop #50076 – EB W Pender St FS Burrard St

C-YA LATER!

The letter “C” used to indicate the route was served with only community shuttle buses. Today, we operate our bus fleet interchangeably, depending on demand, to better serve our customers.

We’re continuing to phase out the “C” on community shuttle bus routes. On June 25, we’re saying “c-ya” to the “C” on the following routes:

TransLink Maintenance and Repair Program

We’re making critical investments in aging infrastructure across the system to keep customers safe, comfortable and moving across a reliable transit network every day.

There are currently 98 active projects, a \$200 million investment, for everything from fleet replacement to major SkyTrain station upgrades!

This includes seismic upgrades and accessibility improvements to Waterfront Station’s SeaBus terminal, and the Granville Station escalator replacement project. The project’s complexity means the three main escalators at Granville Station, which are the longest in Metro Vancouver, will be built piece-by-piece on site!

New transit fares effective July 1

Phase One of the Mayors Council’s 10-Year Vision calls for much-needed transit investments to increase capacity, reduce overcrowding and introduce bus service to new areas.

To help fund these investments, the Mayors’ Council identified annual increases to transit fares over the next decade. These minor fare increases will help bring more and better service to everyone in the region.

On July 1, fares will increase by 5 to 10 cents for single-use fares, 25 cents for DayPasses and \$1 to \$2 for Monthly Passes. Customers who pay cash fares on the bus will still need to pay with exact change.

Even with these modest increases, Metro Vancouver continues to have the lowest average fares of all major Canadian cities.
