

2019 Lost Time Accidents








On-Time Performance


- Q1 OTP was 94.5%


2019 OTP Monthly Performance

State of Good Repair – Vehicle Maintenance

Inspections:

- 299 trains inspected. Inspections are performed every 20,000 kilometres.
- 216 HVAC units cleaned or inspected

Replacements:

- 127 wheelsets lathed/turned
- 21 MKI wheelsets changed out
- 13 MKII wheelsets changed out
- 8 MKI trucks changed out
- 4 MKII trucks changed out

Mark III Procurement Status Update • Trains 1 and Train 2 are in full revenue service • Trains 3, 4 and 5 are currently be commissioned on our system

- Train 6 arrived in Burnaby in June lacksquare
- Train 7 is undergoing endurance testing in Kingston
- First service increase September 2019 \bullet
- All 14 trains anticipated to be in service by the end of Q2 2020.







Canada Line Train Procurement Update



- Current fleet expansion includes 12 trains, which equals 24 cars.
- Train 1 scheduled for delivery in August.
- Anticipated in service date November








Safety trends – our employees

Operator Assaults/CUTA 1-4 (Jan - Mar)




 Highest increase in assaults occurring in Downtown Vancouver and Coquitlam.



Access Transit Service Delivery update

- Working together with Riders' Alliance
 - Four roundtable meetings so far
 - Topics: Feedback, complexity of service, challenges, changes already implemented
- Improving supplemental taxi service
 - June: Survey for customers recently on a taxi trip
 - Meeting quarterly with Taxi Association
- Right-sizing the HandyDART fleet
 - RFP posted for contractor to develop/administer a study to identify whether HandyDART vehicles meet the needs of customers

Battery-electric bus pilot

Pilot details

-Route 100 between 22nd Street Station and Marpole Loop

-Two New Flyer and two Nova buses

Charging stations

- -Construction/installation has begun at both 22nd Street and Marpole
- -Scheduled for completion in June

Training

 Affected conventional Bus Operators will begin training in late June







OTAP pilot **Onboard Technology Assets Program**

- May-Oct: Fleet pilot with 97 buses
- Updated equipment: \bullet
 - Replacing radio systems
 - Replacing onboard computers and touchscreens
 - Adding new routers
 - Installing new camera hardware







Apprenticeship Program graduates

- 14 students graduated from our Maintenance Apprenticeship Program on May 15
- Currently 45 students in the program at various stages of studies/work experience






Wire Theft Awareness






